

That a tax of twenty cents on every one hundren dollars of the as-sessed value of all real and personal property, situate and being in the corporate limits of the Town of Manning, shall be levied and collected for the fiscal year, commencing the second Monday in April 1902, and ending the second Monday in April 1903; also, that this tax shall apply to all life and fire insurance Companies, or other corporations doing business in this town, upon the gross premiums, or in-comes of said Companies, or corpora-

Sec. 3. That the clerk shall, after that date make up the tax register, use the records of the previous year, or obtain it from County Auditor's office.

Sec. 4. That the Commutation tax, in lieu of work on Streets shall be two

Sec. 5. That all taxes herein required, shall be paid between October 1st, 1902, and November 1st, 1902. Sec. 6. That a penalty of 15 per cent shall be added after that date, for fifteen days, before the Town shall take steps to enforce payment of any delinquent tax. Ratified by council Aug., 27, 1902.


