DEATH OF GEN. E. W. MOISE A Distinguished Son Of Sumter and of the State.

Sumter, December 8.—Special: Gen. W. Moise died at his home in this 7.30 o'clock to-night, aged 70 city at years and 7 months. He had been ill since the early part of October, but at Rigby. first his condition was not serious and no apprehension was felt, and his family and friends looked forward to his early recovery. Several weeks ago his illness developed alarming symptoms, and since then it has been known that

Gen. Moise was a native of Charleston, where he was born May 21, 1832, and where his family had resided from colonial times. He was educated in the schools and academies of Charleston, but did not take a full collegiate course. Yet by study and wide reading he more than overcame the handicap that the want of greater educational advantages might have been. During the latter part of the war between the States he was appointed colonel of the 10th Georgia regiment, Young's brigade, Hampthe little fellows. He canvassed the State ith Hampton, speaking in nearly every county, and vas elected Adjutant and Inspector General, which office he held for two terms, declining re-election in 1880. The second year he held this office he gave his entire salary to the public schools of the State. He served as a Presidential elector in 1880. He married Miss Esther Lyon, of Petersburg, Va.. who, with eleven children, survives him. The arrangements for the funeral have not yet been made.

GEN. MOISE'S MILITARY CAREER. Gen. Moise was a gallant Confederate oldier, as everyone in South Carolina knows. He was one of the volunteers who undertook the capture of Fort Puaski. His official enrollment in the service of the Confederacy took place at Columbus, Ga., in June, 1861. When his company was reorganized he was unanimously elected captain of Company A, 7th, Confederate regiment. The company went to Virginia in 1862, just after the battle of Seven Pines, and was assigned to duty in the counties of Isle of Wight, Surrey and Fansemond. Gen. Moise was engaged under Gen. R. A. Pryor in the battle of Kelley's Crossroads, near Suffolk, against Gen. Corcoran. In the attack upon Butler's Tower and Fort Powhatan, below Petersburg, he had three horses killed under him, and was presented by Gen. James Dearing with a letter and three fine captured horses. During one of the cavalry raids of the campaign his command held Babbett's Ford, capturing more men than it had in line He was next engaged in a fight with a Federal gunboat at Smithville. The gunboat was captured and her flag was sent home by Gen. Moise as a
