DEATH OF GEN. E. W. MOISE.

A Distinguished Son of Sumter and of the State. Sumter, December 8.—Special: Gen. E. W. Moise died at his home in this city at 7:30 o'clock to-night.

Gen. Moise was a native of Charleston, where he was born May 21, 1832, and where his family had resided from colonial times.

GEN. MOISE'S MILITARY CAREER.

General Moise fought at Brandy Station, Yellow Tavern and Petersburg. He was on the famous "catapult" raid.
