On account of the high price for cotton seed, and the limited time the mills allow for delivery, the farmers are fast getting clear of their seed, and in a short while they will be like the fellow who got drunk on wine at a party and felt bad to realize when all was over "what a difference in the morning." The prices for the past few days were very tempting, but when it is considered that seed will be based on the high price paid for seed for a few days, and not on the low price paid for the bulk bought by the mills, the raiser is not so tempting after all. The man who sells his seed at 30 cents per bushel on scales that weigh 18 cents per bushel, and whose seed is really getting a fine price, if he believes the meal is better fertilizer, but if he has to pay \$25 per ton for the meal then he do not see anything fancy about the price of seed, and you will swap seed for meal, in order to avoid mistakes it is well that both seed and meal be weighed on the same scales. Then people could not go off and complain of the selling, and buying scales at the mills, being different.

Coming Marriage.

The groom, from Sumter, and was formerly married to Miss Kershaw, from whom he was divorced.

Our House delegation have each presented bills for the consideration of the General Assembly. Mr. Lesesne has two, both of which have passed the House, are now in the Senate. The merits of these bills we are not prepared to show, because they are of a nature that lawyers, and not laymen are only competent to decide.

Mr. Lanham who is not a lawyer, but a traveling man, drummer, is the term commonly used for his vocation, has a bill which is aimed to give the traveling public, but drummers especially, the privilege of carrying more baggage, free, than is now allowed by the railroads or steamboats. This measure could be properly classed as "a bill to permit drummers to load down baggage cars without charge for excess." The public generally would get very little benefit from it. Mr. Lanham has another bill, "To permit croppers on shares to give liens for allowances with written consent of their landlords." We have not seen the full text of either of Mr. Lanham's bills, but if the title is correct, we do not see the necessity for the latter, because, unless our mind is greatly at fault, "croppers on shares" can give their liens "with the written consent of their landlords." and it is sometimes the case, that "croppers" who work share crops, with a "landlord" who is unable to furnish supplies, and to get them, he either joins the "croppers" in giving a lien, or he gives his consent in writing, and that should be done, in other words he signs a waiver of priority, hence our view that such a bill is unnecessary.

Mr. DeSchaaps has a bill which from its title, appears important, and which is the protection of the public roads, "to protect highways from parallel or intersecting tramways." We have not seen the text of his bill either, but if it is what its title indicates to our mind, it seeks to prevent the running of tramways alongside of the public roads which are dangerous to life and property, and we hope Mr. DeSchaaps will go a step further and include protection from telephone lines. In our opinion, there is immediate need of legislation which will forbid the hanging of a telephone or any other electrical contrivance, within 200 feet of a public highway. There is absolutely as much danger, if not more, from telephone wires, than from tram roads, because with the latter, one has time to jump out of the way, but with the former it is impossible to dodge lightning. Mr. DeSchaaps' bill commends itself to our judgment, if we understand it.

Last Saturday there was a bill looking to putting the election of the members of the Auditor's office in the hands of the people, and we are glad to note that all three members in the House from Clarendon voted against it, and that Mr. Lesesne supported the bill, on the ground that it would open the way to more scandal. We would be glad if our delegation whenever any one of them introduce a measure, would send us a copy of the bill, as it is, so we may rely on the brief bills as published in the newspapers. It would be preferable to have the full text so we can present it intelligently to our readers who are their constituents.
