On last Saturday night fire was discovered in the seed house of the Davis Oil mill, and it was immediately drenched and put out. Miss Gordon and several of the ladies in the vicinity are going to serve refreshments where the young folks may enjoy themselves treating each other.

The sale of the S. M. Nexsen stock of general merchandise took place last Friday and was knocked down to Mr. William Nexsen for \$5,025. Hon. W. J. Johnson of Ridgeway, S. C., was present at the sale. Mr. Johnson is a large merchant, and a prominent member of the Legislature, and on his return from the sale he told us that he was very much impressed with the lands between Manning and Nexsen's.
