The Old Superstition About July 13 and the Weather.

The old superstition about St. Swithin and the rain has very generally died Those who regard water finding by out. There are still, however, a good many who incline to the belief that tice of a foolish superstition will be such a notion must have had a basis of scientific fact or it could not have obtained as it has done for centuries. Some years ago the records of Greenwich observatory were examined for twenty years with a view to ascertaining whether as a matter of fact a rainy July 15 is usually followed by a rainy period approximating to forty

It was found that the years in which St. Swithin's day had given no rain were rather wetter during the following forty days than other years. It was concluded that the tradition had no meteorological facts whatever to support it. Everybody has heard the old story about the removal of St. Swithin's bones on July 15 and of the manner in which the saint resented it by deluging the district. It is a curious fact, but well authenticated, that the good man's bones were shifted from their original resting place in circumstances of considerable pomp and splendor and without a arop of rain falling. 
