TIMBER PRESERVATION.

The Most Perfect Method Is also the Most Expensive.

Telephone poles nearly always decay at or just below the ground line. The upper portion of the pole, permanently in the air, rapidly drying after rain, is practically always dry and is rarely found decayed. The butt of the pole, deeply buried in the ground, is in a permanently damp condition, but oxygen being excluded it is seldom badly affected. Close to the ground line the soil retains the moisture and keeps the wood constantly damp where it is exposed to the air and to the heat of the sun, which is just what its little vege-
