Colored School Commencement.

THE PRIZE CONTEST.

As an encouragement to the pupils who show talent as speakers, others who have made a perfect record in attendance and deportment, some kind of prize will be awarded. It is a truth that good records made in school become apart of one's life after school and will be the means of making a boy a reliable man, always punctual and prompt to the call of duty.

Six prizes will be awarded to contest speakers, and four for attendance and scholarship. Those offering prizes this year are, Mr. S. R. Venning, Manning Furniture Co., and Mr. S. L. Davis.

Among the colored people, R. A. White, \$5.00 for pupil making the best record in first grade; Alex Tindal, \$5.00 for pupil making highest per cent. in scholarship; Ed. Hatfield, \$5.00 prize for contest; Augustus Collins, \$2.00 for contest prize. Several prizes will be secured from white friends.

The management of the colored school here has been encouraged by many who have given small donations of some sort. We are pleased to announce the gift of a large map from the office of the County Superintendent of Education, five of the latest bulletins from the United States Department of Agriculture, latest map of South Carolina showing Jasper and Dillon counties from Mr. Watson, Secretary of Agriculture, of south Carolina, five volumes of books from Dr. C. B. Geiger, All of this shows that the right sort of education for negroes is being encouraged and supported by the leaders of the superior race.

Among the colored people, Alex Tindal and Ed Walker, took the lead in the Baptist and Methodist Churches respectively, in raising \$25 to assist in building flues and making other improvements.

THE SPEAKERS.

Ample accommodations will be made for white people who wish to attend the commencement of the colored school. The speakers are among the best in the State. Prof. Wilkinson, President of State College, is one of the most influential educators among negroes; while Rev. M. D. Lee of Rock Hill, is a general officer in the Methodist Zion Church, he is a foremost educator and holds the reputation of being one of the greatest orators of his race. Mr. Charlton DuRant, of the Manning Bar, needs no introduction. He, like Capt. W. C. Davis, is a man of high esteem and a speaker who can entertain an audience with much ease.

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING.

For three years a course of industrial training or more properly putting it, domestic science, has been had in the negro school here. The work proceeds along a line per a schedule and is conducted by a graduate of Booker Washington school, without any expense to the tax payers of this school district. The same teacher is County Supervisor, and many other schools have been reached. The pupils are taught to make useful articles, and do fancy work, how to cut patterns, darn and stitch, and make door mats out of shucks, table baskets out of reed and raffia.

The negro people have been trying to get away from the memories of past times that are sweet to the recollections of the "old people," the melodies that we use to sing on the plantations. We are going to give our hearers a treat in songs that are real negro in dialect and religion, yet set to music that is charming and beautiful. We have secured a number of song books from Hampton Institute most of them entitled "Negro Folk Song," "Nursery Rhymes," and other melodies. Several strong choruses are to be had all of which will be pleasing to the commencement goers.
