An Ordinance

To prohibit the manufacture, compounding, sale, barter, exchange, storing, spirituous, malt, vinous, fermented, brewed or other beverages which contain alcohol.

Sec. 2. That any person convicted of violating the provisions of this Ordinance as to the sale, barter, exchange, or giving away of any of the articles herein prohibited shall be fined in a sum of not less than \$10, nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisonment for not less than 10 days nor more than thirty days.

Sec. 3. That any person or persons, firm, corporation, drug store, or company, convicted of the violation of this Ordinance by the manufacturing, compounding, keeping or storing in his, her, their or its possession for unlawful use and disposal any of the articles herein prohibited, such store, drug store or business, shall be declared a common nuisance, and in addition to the penalty prescribed in Section 2 of this Ordinance, the license to such business in the town of Manning of such person, firm or corporation or drug store, shall be revoked.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance be and are hereby repealed.

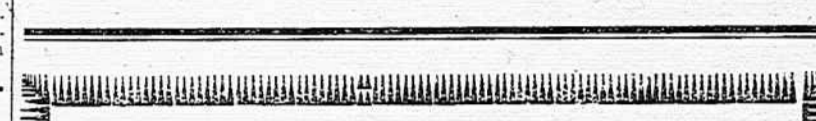
