We have a letter from some citizens of the Epworth League who express the opinion that it is an opportune time to put forth an effort to negotiate with the Seaboard railroad, now building into Timmonsville and should go through the towns of Olanza, Turberville, New Zion, Sardinia, Manning and Summerton, from thence to Ferguson over the Santee bridge. We agree with these gentlemen that it is an opportune time for all of the towns over this contemplated route to interest themselves and arrange for committees from their respective communities to confer with the railroad authorities and ascertain from them what would be necessary to induce this road to come to us. It was suggested in this letter that a meeting be called after the campaign meeting of yesterday to take this matter into consideration, but thinking that it would be hard to get such a matter its proper consideration after a political meeting we wrote the gentlemen suggesting that another date be fixed for the purpose. We would suggest that the several municipal authorities act in behalf of the subject in their respective towns by calling meetings of their citizens, and then appoint committees with authority to go to the railroad people with certain pledges. There will be, in our opinion, no present request with nothing substantial to get the requests, and no committee can be of much influence unless it has the authority to make pledges for the community they represent. We would also suggest to our town council to be held on this matter at this matter at once, and for the Mayor to see the proper persons who are in a position to be of help, and get them interested in the scheme.
