





FIELD DAY

SURVEYOR and CIVIL ENGINEER The following program for Field Day has been adopted by the Teachers' Association of Clar-

endon County.

Field Day in nearly all counties of the State has come to be cognized as a very important day. Clarendon County has enoved these features annually for the past three years.

In order to vary these features somewhat, and to extend the benefits and pleasures as widely as possible among all our people, it has been deemed advisable to have smaller features of a like kind conducted at the following places at some date the last of March, or the first of April, preceding the general Field day to be ld at Manning on Friday, April, 16th, 1915.

Local arrangements to be left to the Principals of the schools

in each of the following school groups, or to committees arranged

Paxville Group-Consisting of Paxville, Pinewood, Big Branch, Home Branch. Silver, Grange Hall, and Pineland. nerton Group-Consisting of Summerton, Davis Station, Oak Grove, Cross Roads, Panola, Richbourg, St. Paul.

nia Group-Consisting of Sardinia. Enterprise, Harmony, Oakdale, Salem, New Zion, Barrow, Clarendon. Manning Group-Consisting of Manning, Jordan, Alcola, Trinity,

Harrin Foreston, Wilson, Deep Creek, Rehoboth, Line, Holiaday, Baywood, Thigpen, New Harmony. arbeville Group—Consisting of Turbeville, Coker, Gamble, Hicks. McFaddin, Barrineau, and the line schools if they

Each school should send three representatives, one from each class, to the group contest feature. (Dates to be arranged for by

Each group will be entitled to three representatives, one from

each class, to take part in the county field day contests. It should be noted that there are five school groups, and three classes of contestants, will make up fifteen entries for the general

This gives five entries for each class. The prize for each class will be either a gold medal, or some other prize of equal

Pupils who by merit shall be selected as the representatives, either from your school to the group contest, or at the group contest for the county contest, may speak the same piece, or prepare an entirely different piece. (Original or selected.)

Another special feature for the county field day will be a spelling contest in which the best speller wins. This is open to schemes for getting two.-Toledo ly in future Arctic expeditions.-Popany and all pupils. Send to E. J. Browne, County Supt. for a printed list of fifteen hundred words which will be used.

ATHLETIC CONTESTS.

Teachers should encourage their pupils to engage in the following exercises: Running high jump, running broad jump, standing high jump, standing broad jump, and racing contests, all of which contests should be divided by age as per the speaking con-

Each school group may select both a boy and a girl representative for each of the above contests, and dived by age as above

Vacances may be filled at any time, both for the speaking contests, and the athletic contests, so that there may be no features without the proper number of contestants. This is especially desireable in the contests for the prizes for the speaking. Small prizes will be given the winners in the athletic contests

on the occasion of the general field day. The speaking contests for the general field day at Manning on Friday April 16th, will begin at 19:30 o, clock, followed by the

spelling contest. Dinner will be served about 1 o'clock in groups, according to your own individual arrangements: The athletic contests will take place immediately after dinner,

followed by basket ball, base ball, etc. Let each school group arrange to provide a pleasant day for

all the patrons of your respective schools. All names of contestants should be sent in promptly before the general field day, stating from what school or schools such ones are from, their classification, and any other data that will enable us to have matters in good shape.


