All joints in lead pipe shall be wiped solder joints. Waste and vent pipes made of iron shall fulfill same requirements as prescribed in section 13. The joint with the iron pipe shal be either screw or lead caulked and with the lead pipe by wiped solder joint.

Sec. 15. All traps shall be adequate y protected from a loss of seal through evaporation, syphonage or air pressure under all conditions and the Inspector shall in each case determine whether these conditions are adequate and in compliance with sanitary conditions. All traps shall have a seal of not less than two inches. Whenever possible the continuous system of venting shall be used omitting crown vent, and using only traps. having a horizontal outlet. By continuous venting is meant that the branch vent is essentially a continutrap discharging into this line with short connection, otherwise crown venting is permitted. Each trap shall be provided with a cleanout below the sewerage department. water level in the trap except in the

> Sec. 20. All materials must be of good standard quality and the work manlike manner.

Wooden wash trays and sinks shall not be allowed unless they are lined with non-absorbent metal and such lining shall fold over the edge and extend 3 inches down the outside of the sink or tray so that the wood will be free from contact of water or liquids. No wooden lined bath tubs or urinals shall be allowed.

Sec. 21. No person or persons shall injure, break, remove or obstruct any portion of any manhole, lamp hole, flush tank or any part of the public sewer. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be fined \$25.00 or be imprisoned for a period of not more than 30 days.

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to deposit any matter or which is liable to impair the sewers or obstruct the flow of the sewerage Occupants of premises which have connections with the sewer system shall be held accountable for any abuse of the sewerage system. Depositing kitchen refuse, fruit peelings, waste, rags, stiff paper or any such matter in closet bowls is prohibited In all cases where stoppages are caused by abuse of the system the property owners shall defray the expense

The sewer department shall have with coal pitch varnish or liquid the power to prevent or discontinue any connection with the public sewers which discharges any substance liable to injure the sewers or obstruct the flow of the sewerage.

Sec. 22. No exhause steam shall be allowed into the public sewer. Sec. 23. At the foot of every line of soil pipe and kitchen waste pipe shall be left a clean out hermetically sealed, and a plug of solid brass screwed Combination D are prohibited. Plugs must be of brass and substantial.

Sec. 24. Water closets having traps above the floor using lead connections must have a cast brass flange or other improved pattern. All brass floor flanges for water closets must be made from a pattern similar to the renten flanges with grapho asbestos gasket or the hygienic ground joint connection and the flange shall be securely soldered to the lead and bolt-

ed to the trap or closet. Sec. 25. A running trap four inches internal dlameter may be placed in the sewer line near the foot of the main soil pipe with a fresh air inlet connected to the house side of the trap, with opening not nearer than twentyfive feet of the foundation walls of the house, and a 4 inch stack connected with the sewer line of said trap and extended vertirally four feet above

the roof. Sec. 26. The connection at property line between 4 inch and 6 inch pipe shall be made by a 6 inch by a 4 inch reducer.

Sec. 27. Brass ferrules where required by the rules shall fulfill the following specifications, to-wit: Four inch ferrules shall be not less than four inches long nor weigh less

than one and one-half pounds. Two inch ferrules shall not be less than three inches long, nor weigh less than three-quarters of a pound and must be of good quality and free from

All matters pertaining to sanitary plumbing not cevered by this ordinance, or any slight diversion ance of the branch waste, the fixture from this ordinance which is in accordance with or improvement in sanitary condtions will be left to the decision if the Plumbing Inspector and

Sec. 29. All ordinances or parts of case of a bath tub waste in which case ordinances conflicting with this ordinonce are hereby repealed.

Violation of this ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of not less than one dollar and not more than \$25.00 or imprisonment for not more than 30 days at the discretion of the Mayor. 
