

Ordinances, Rules And Regulations Governing The Waterworks Department In The Town Of Manning, S. C.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Town Council, in council assembled, that the following rules shall be a part of the contract with every person who takes water supplied by the Town of Manning from the Town Waterworks.

Sec. 1. Application for water must be made by the owner or agent of the property... Sec. 2. At the time of making the application the applicant shall pay to the Waterworks Department, taking their receipt therefor, the sum to cover the costs of making the tap upon the Water mains of the corporation...

Sec. 11. Every house or building to be connected with the public sewer shall be separately connected unless special permit is granted for combined connections...

Sec. 9. The Inspector as far as may be necessary to the performance of his duties, has the right to enter any building or premises for the purpose of locating unsanitary work without interference or hindrance, and he shall have the power to condemn all unsanitary work and order the same put in sanitary condition... Sec. 10. No person shall directly or indirectly, connect any open gutter, cesspool, privy vault, or rain water conductors with the sanitary sewer...

front washout closet and pan and plunger closet are prohibited. Water closets shall not be flushed by direct service from water pipes, but by special tanks placed in such position as to give at least a head of six feet, except where regular low tanks or overflow flushometers are used... Sec. 19. All fixtures shall be wholly exposed when possible or practical... Sec. 20. All materials must be of good standard quality and the work must be done in a thorough and workmanlike manner...

Neuralgia.

Severe neuralgia can be cured by injecting alcohol into the nerves, but the cost is terrible, for the price is the cost of the nerve, with paralysis as the result. Such a brief, in the conclusion which Dr. Williams B. Caldwell reports to the Journal of the American Medical Association after experiments made at the laboratory of neuropathology of the University of Pennsylvania. The alcohol kills not only the nerves of sensation, but the motor nerves as well. In a nerve like the sciatic this would be serious. For the nerve to remain paralyzed for a year after the injection of the alcohol, is trifling neuralgia, which is caused by a purely sensory nerve, this action is of little importance. 

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An Ordinance

An ordinance to prevent the dumping of Trash and Rubbish in the streets of the Town of Manning, and to prevent the Dumping of Trash and Rubbish in Lots in rear of stores and business places, and providing Punishment for the same. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Manning, and by authority of the same: Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to deposit or Dump any Garbage or Raskins or Trash from any yards or lots or residences, or stores, or other business places of said Town into the streets or drains of said Town.

Sec. 2. That it shall be unlawful for any merchants or other persons to deposit or Dump any Trash or Waste, or Rubbish in any back lots of said Town in such manner as to endanger the health of citizens of said Town, or to cause or increase fire risks to stores or other buildings.

Sec. 3. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to recklessly throw papers and other unsightly articles in the streets of said Town instead of placing same in the waste cans provided as receptacles for the same.

Sec. 4. Any person convicted of violating this ordinance shall be fined or imprisoned in the discretion of the Mayor of the said town, or authority provided as receptacles for the same to the extent of \$10 dollars fine or 15 days imprisonment.

AN ORDINANCE

To Regulate the Use of the Sewerage System in the Town of Manning. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Town Council, in Council assembled:

Section 1. The plumbing and sewerage system in the town of Manning shall be under the control of the Council Superintendent of sewers, and the duty of securing and enforcing a full compliance with all rules and regulations governing sewerage connections with the public sewers, shall be vested in the Council Superintendent of sewers or his authorized agent.

The duly authorized agents of the sewer and plumbing system shall be the Engineer-Superintendent and Inspector of plumbing and sewers who shall be elected as provided for such in the governing elections by Council, and shall receive such compensation as the Council shall fix and whose duties are defined in subsequent sections.

It shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation carrying on a business of sanitary plumbing and sewerage to register in a book provided for that purpose at the office of the Engineer-Superintendent and Inspector of plumbing and sewers for the town of Manning, giving name

and place of business. Whereupon after receiving a certificate from the Engineer-Superintendent that he is satisfied as to their qualifications to carry on the business of sanitary plumbing they can obtain a license to carry on the business of sanitary plumbing in the town of Manning.

All master plumbers shall, before employing a journeyman plumber or allowing him to begin work, require said journeyman plumber to report at the office of the plumbing inspector for the purpose of registering his name.

Sec. 6. It shall be the duty of the Engineer-Superintendent and Inspector of Plumbing and Sewers to periodically inspect plans on file for making house connections and all plumbing work connected therewith as provided in section 3 and to accept, reject or make such alterations in the plumbing in such house as he may deem necessary to the security of proper sanitary house connections with the public sewers.

Sec. 7. It shall be the duty of the Engineer-Superintendent and Inspector of Plumbing and Sewers to issue all permits, notices, and certificates, to keep a daily record of the work including all notices and applications received, permits granted and certificates given. He shall inspect all house connections and their construction from time to time sufficiently to see that all plumbing, drainage and sewerage work is done in accordance with these rules and regulations. He shall, as soon as possible after notification by the plumber, proceed to inspect and pass upon the work, apply such tests as may be from time to time prescribed, and have any defects immediately remedied under his supervision. He shall promptly condemn and order the removal of any defective work done contrary to the spirit of the regulations and the specifications governing house connections.

Sec. 8. No plumbing work newly installed shall be used until duly inspected upon and approved by the Inspector.

Sec. 9. The Inspector as far as may be necessary to the performance of his duties, has the right to enter any building or premises for the purpose of locating unsanitary work without interference or hindrance, and he shall have the power to condemn all unsanitary work and order the same put in sanitary condition, a specified time will be given in which the latter can be remedied, and any person who interferes with the plumber in the performance of his duties shall be fined \$100, or be imprisoned for a period of not more than 10 days.

Sec. 10. No person shall directly or indirectly, connect any open gutter, cesspool, privy vault, or rain water conductors with the sanitary sewer.
