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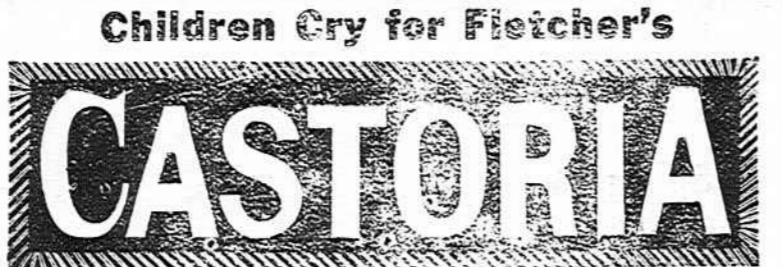

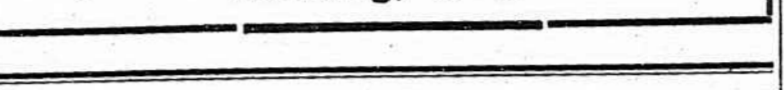

Those who want low grade flour or shorts with their exchange, we allow 1 3 more for each pound of high grade flour, or an exchange as follows in any proportion:

30 lbs. high grade flour, 7 1 2 lbs. low grade, and 12 1-2 lbs. bran. Where all low grade is taken we allow 52 1-2 lbs and 1 1-2 lbs bran.
