STORY OF HOME, SWEET HOME

Net Written While Payne Was Poverty-Stricken. But When He Was Fairly Comfortable.

It is more than ninety years since "Home, Sweet Home" was written, but its popularity is still world-wide and wherever the English language is spoken it is known and loved because it appeals to that deep-seated instinct in humanity which is the basis of family life.

Many stories have been written of its origin, most of them more or less inaccurate and tending to distort reality by a mass of pleasing fiction.

Moving word pictures have been drawn of the starving author in his garret and illustrations have been published of the original "lowly thatched cottage" for which he was supposedly pining, both affecting and interesting, but not in accordance with the facts.

Although he had periods of failure and hardship, as well as possibly brief periods of success and prosperity, it was not while suffering from poverty that he wrote "Home, Sweet Home," but during a time when he was living comfortably in Paris in the Palais Royal, and having considerable success in his dramatic work.

There is also no evidence to indicate that the "lowly thatched cottage" had any existence outside of the author's brain, in spite of the tradition which has been built up about the Easthampton cottage.

Throughout his life Payne had a deep affection for his native land, his friends and his family, from whom he was for many years widely separated. His letters frequently allude to his longing for the society of those he loved and his appreciation of the home and domestic life.

He was only fifteen years of age when necessity forced him to begin his battle with the world, a precocious, high-spirited, impulsive, sensitive, ambitious boy, conscious of an intellect above the normal, restive under restraint, quick to take offense at seeming slight.—T. Muilage to Stick on Tin. Whoever has tried to stick a paper label on a piece of tin knows how difficult it is. Here, however, is a recipe for a muilage especially designed for this purpose: In 150 cubic centimeters of boiling water dissolve 20 grams of gum tragacanth and add a paste made of 60 grams of flour and 10 grams of dextrine dissolved in 40 cubic centimeters of water. Dilute the whole with 200 cubic centimeters of boiling water and add 10 grams of glycerine and 10 grams of salicylic acid. Boil for five minutes, stirring constantly.

Beware of Strange Mushrooms.
If strangers appear in your mushroom bed, look out! A professional mushroom grower recently was badly fooled and, with his entire family of five persons, narrowly escaped death. Hence the mushroom specialists of the United States department of agriculture have issued a warning to commercial and other growers of mushrooms to regard with suspicion any abnormal mushrooms which appear in their beds. It seems that occasionally sporadic forms appear in mushroom beds, persist for a day or two, and then disappear. These are generally manure-inhabiting species and may be observed shortly after the beds have been eased. In the instance cited, however, these fungi appeared in considerable numbers at the time the edible Agaricus campestris should have been ready for the market, and the dealer supposed it was probably a new brown variety and tried it in his own family. As a result, they were rendered absolutely helpless and were saved after several hours only through the assistance of a second physician who had had experience with this type of poisoning.

He Was Prepared.
One afternoon recently a New York traveling man called on a prominent El Paso (Texas) attorney in consultation at one of the leading hotels. He explained that he contemplated a very perilous undertaking and desired to make his will. Fumigating Paper.
There are many formulas for making fumigating paper, one of the most simple being: Benzoin, 1 av. ounce; storax, one-half ounce; fumigating essence, 2 fl. ounces; ether, 1 fl. ounce; acetic acid, glacial, 20 drops; alcohol, 2 fl. ounces. Dissolve the benzoin and storax in a mixture of the alcohol and ether, filter, and add the fumigating essence and the acetic acid. Spread the mixture upon filtering or bibulous paper (blotting paper e.g.) and allow it to dry. To prevent sticking, dust the surface with talcum, and preserve in wax paper. When used, the paper is simply warmed, or held over a lamp.

Keeping Blooms Fresh.
Flowers begin to bleed as soon as they are cut, and the precious sap running out of them causes the cells to collapse immediately. To prevent this, the end of the stem must be quickly closed, and this is best done by searing in a flame or by placing directly in hot water. For corsage bouquets the searing process is best, although a little tedious, as each stem must be so treated.


