Austrian Counter-Attacks Fail to Re cover Positions.

Rome, Aug. 28.-The Italians made further progress yesterday on the Banzizza plateau, on the front north of Gorizia, the war office announces. The Austrians made violent counterattacks, but failed to recover positions taken by the Italians. The announcement : ' ws:

"On the whole ba-

front there were artillery actions principally yes terday. On the Banzizza plateau our troops, continuing their progress, have been in closer contact with the enemy. Vigorous local attacks assured for us some positions which the enemy failed to recapture, although he made violent counter-attacks. "Unfavorable atmospheric condi-

tions greatly impeded the activity of our airplanes."
