STATEMENT ON TAXES

Collector Heyward Explains Phases of War Revenue Bill.

Columbia, Oct. 28.—The collector of internal revenue has given out the following information with reference to some of the new war taxes, which go into effect on November 1, 1917.

The rate of tax on all commodities transported by freight shall be three (3) per cent of the amount paid for such transportation. This applies to transportation by either rail or water, or by any form of mechanical power when in competition with carriers by rail or water, consigned from one point in the United States to an-

In case a carrier does not, because of its ownership of the commodity transported, or for any other reason, receive the amount which as a carrier it would otherwise charge, then the carrier shall pay a tax equivalent to the tax which would be imposed upon the transportation of such commodity if the carrier received payment for such transportation.
