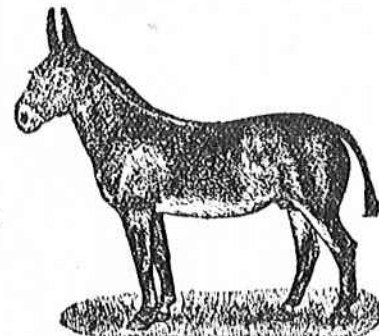

NEED FOOD FOR ALLIED COUNTRIES

President Wilson Calls Upon People to Eliminate Waste During War.

Washington, Oct. 23.—President Wilson wants the families of the land to enroll themselves in the great army of food conservationists. In a

statement issued today he asks every one in the country to do their bit towards saving the nation's food supply.

The chief executive's message to Americans follows:

"The chief part of the burden of finding food supplies for the peoples associated with us in war falls for the present upon the American people, and the drain on supplies on such

a scale necessarily affects the prices of our necessities of life.

"Our country, however, is blessed with an abundance of foodstuffs, and if our people will economize in their use of food, providently confining themselves to the quantities required for the maintenance of health and strength; if they will eliminate waste; and if they will make use of these commodities of which we have a surplus and thus free for export a large proportion of these required by the world now dependent upon us, we shall not only be able to accomplish our obligations to them, but we shall obtain and establish reasonable prices at home.

"To provide an adequate supply of food both for our own soldiers on the other side of the seas and for the civil population and the armies of the Allies is one of our first and foremost obligations; for if we are to maintain their constancy in this struggle for the independence of all nations, we must first maintain their health and strength. The solution of our food problems, therefore, is dependent upon the individual service of every man, woman and child in the United States. The great voluntary effort in this direction which has been initiated and organized by the food administration under my direction offers an opportunity of service in the war which is open to every individual, and by which every individual may serve both his own people and the people of the world.

"We cannot accomplish our objects in this great war without sacrifice and devotion, and in no direction can that sacrifice and devotion be shown more than by each home and public eating place in the country pledging its support to the food administration and complying with its requests." The campaign for family enroll-

ment week will be vigorously conducted. More than half a million workers will make a house to house canvass, asking that pledge cards be signed. Families and restaurants will be asked to conserve staples, such as wheat, meat, sugar, pork, and so on.

HELPING THE MEAT AND MILK SUPPLY

The Production of More and Better Farm Animals is Both Patriotic and Profitable.

Cooler weather should not mean less care in the handling of milk and cream. Even though the weather is cooler, summer precautions are necessary if a first-grade product is to be delivered.

Scrub balls to the number of 1,000,000 ate \$40,000,000 worth of feed last year and at the same time failed to improve the calf crop. Good pure-bred bulls cost no more to keep and they will produce calves that are better than their dams.

Fall storms and cold rains seriously reduce the milk yield of dairy cows which are without shelter. Once reduced, the milk flow is increased with difficulty and at the price of extra feed. Protection pays well.

Milk should be produced with the minimum quantity of grain, for grain is costly, and economical production is desired. With a ration composed of an abundance of corn silage and legume hay satisfactory results can be obtained with the minimum of grain.
