She told of the preference of the boys for garments issued from the Red Cross rather than from the government, and also of their deep appreciation of the noble work of our women.


By the request of our chairman, Mr. Burgess, Mrs. Sprott suggested that a Junior Red Cross be organized. This matter is under careful consideration, and we hope to report good results later.

So great a success was this first tea that it was decided to make it a weekly event. While the Red Cross is not a social organization, the ladies feel that a weekly social hour, when the members can get together to discuss the work, will be of benefit and will give a new impetus to this work. They voluntarily offered to continue donating the refreshments. While the room will be opened at the usual hour each day, the Red Cross extends a cordial invitation to all visitors and particularly to those who are not members to visit the headquarters at that time.
