

TERMS OF THE THIRD LIBERTY LOAN

To the Banks and Trust Companies and the Public of the Fifth Federal Reserve District: Following is the announcement of the Secretary of the Treasury relating to the Third Liberty Loan:

pon will be for 120 days' interest and will be payable September 15, 1918, after which interest will be payable semi-annually, March 15th and September 15th. This arrangement as to interest dates is made in order to avoid having the interest payments on this series of bonds fall upon approximately the same dates as those of the Second Liberty Loan.

Not Convertible "The bonds are not convertible and are not subject to call for redemption before maturity. The bonds carry the same exemptions from taxation as those of the Second Liberty Loan." Sinking Fund "The bill authorizes the Secretary of the Treasury to purchase Third Liberty Loan Bonds to the amount of one-twentieth of the original issue of such bonds during the first year, and in each subsequent year, one-twentieth

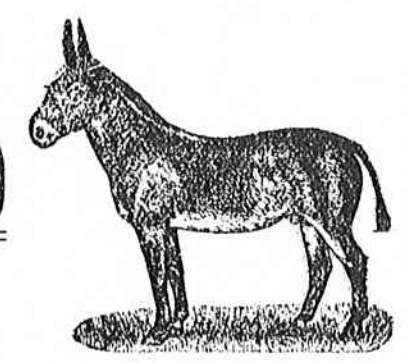
