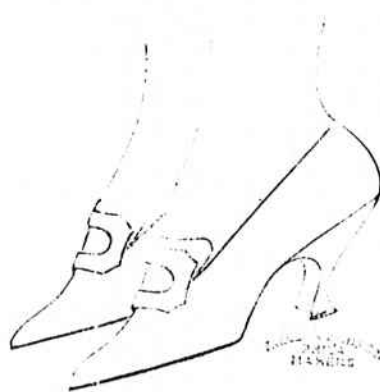

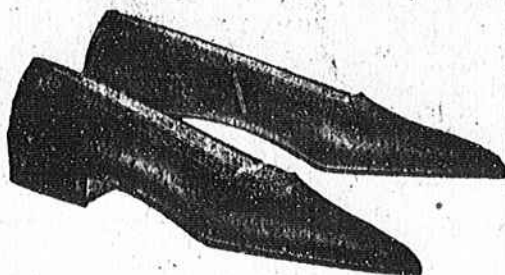

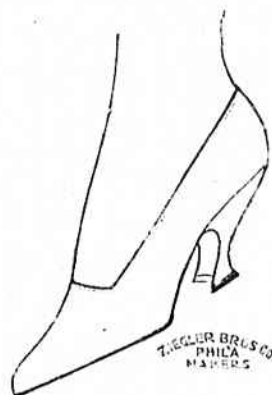

in Artois and Picardy, and the German Crown Prince for dynastic reasons will strive to outdo whatever success is attained by his colleague farther north.

American Troops In It
It is probable that American troops are engaged in the fighting in both battles on the French fronts.

It is known that American troops are close behind the Allied line in Flanders, while some time ago it was reported that they were near Rheims.

The late official reports note quite severe fighting in various sectors, among them the Apremont forest, where Americans are known to be holding positions at the present time. The reports say the Germans were repulsed in all these attacks.

Americans Attacked
It is officially reported from Washington that American positions in Picardy sector, near Cantigny and Montdidier, have been subjected to attack, and that at places the Germans penetrated them. The enemy, however, was driven out by the Americans.

Almost coincident with the new German assault the Italians launched a blow at the Austrian lines in the mountain region to the northwest of Lake Garda. According to reports they have carried Monticello Pass, the village of Presena, Monte Zigolon and the mountain spur to the east. Before them lie parallel streams leading down into the Lagarina valley and if they successfully carry out their attack there, it is possible to outflank the entire Austrian position in the north of Italy.

CHEMIN-DES-DAMES IS LOST

Huns Have Driven Wedge into Allied Line on Twenty-Five-Mile Front

London, May 28.—The reports from the battlefields of France tonight, both official and unofficial, show that the Allies have again suffered a setback, whereby they have lost all the ground in the Chemin-Des-Dames region so gallantly won by the French in the great struggle from April to October, 1917.

The enemy has driven a wedge into the Allied line on a front of some twenty-five miles, and at last reports the tremendous battle was still continuing about Fismes, which is the center of important Allied communications. French reserves, however, were arriving to contest a further enemy advance at this point.

Up to the present, according to the German claim, 15,000 prisoners have been taken. It is still uncertain whether the Germans intended this attack as a resumption of their full scale offensive.

The fact that only twenty to twenty-five divisions have been engaged is held to indicate that it was not a main attack, but was originally intended to attract Allied forces from before Amiens, an dthat the major operation would be attempted elsewhere.

TWO LONE AMERICANS

Give Huns Opportunity to Report "Prisoners Captured"

With the American Army in France, May 28.—Evening—Two lone Americans gave the Germans an opportunity to mention the capture of "prisoners from American regiments" in the German official communication.

One of the Americans is missing in Picardy and one in the Luneville sector. These are the only men reported missing.

PENSION INCREASE BILL

Senator Thomas, of Colorado, Opposit in Senate

Washington, May 28.—Opposing in the Senate today the pension increase bill which would add \$35,000,000 a year to the government's expenditures, Senator Thomas, of Colorado, Democrat, said the measure was an extravagant one and that both Democrats and Republicans were playing politics with it.

"It has been whispered," he said, "that the passage of the bill might elect forty Democrats Congressmen."

HUNS SEIZE DUTCH SHIPS

Vessels Must Have German Safe Conduct

Amsterdam, May 27.—The Germans have seized and taken into Swine-ruende the Dutch steamship Jantje and sailing vessels Maria, Jacoba and Garzine. This is in pursuance of their policy of not permitting Dutch vessels to sail without German safe conducts, pending arrangement of the transit question between Holland and Germany.

HUGHES ASKS FOR FACTS

Seeks Senate Committee's Information on Aircraft Delays

Washington, May 28.—The Senate military committee was asked today by Charles E. Hughes, conducting the Department of Justice's aircraft investigation, for all information on aircraft delays. It will be turned over immediately. Plans for cooperating the two investigations were discussed by Chairman Chamberlain, of the committee; Mr. Hughes and Attorney General Gregory.

THOUSAND JEWS DROWNED

New York, May 28.—One thousand persons, all Jewish refugees from Batum, were drowned when the steamship Oriole, carrying a passenger list of fifteen hundred, was recently sunk in the Caspian sea, according to a cablegram received and quoted here today by The Jewish Day from its correspondent at Harbin.

No details of the sinking were given.

GERMANS MAKING HEAVY ASSAULTS

Allies Hold Line Firmly Against Heavy Assaults in North—Berlin Claims Crown Prince Gained Ground

THE FIGHTING CONTINUES

German Blow Falls Suddenly With Only Brief Artillery Preparation—Americas Believed in Battle

Germany's great offensive on the western front has been resumed. With only brief artillery preparation two blows have been struck by the Teuton armies, which have been reorganized since disastrous losses were inflicted on them by the French and British during the Picardy and Flanders battles in March and April. One attack was on the line from Voormezele to Loere, southwest of Ypres; the other on a thirty-five mile front from Pinon, north of Soissons to Rheims. This is known as the Aisne sector.

Allies Firm to North
In Flanders the Germans have gained virtually nothing, but farther south the Berlin official statement claims that the German Crown Prince's troops have carried the whole ridge of the Chemin-Des-Dames and now are fighting on the Aisne river.

The German attack in Flanders is against positions taken by the French May 20, when they recaptured Bralose and Loere, and strengthened their line on each side of Hill 44, which they had retaken a few days before.

Recalls Former Battle
On the Aisne front the present battle recalls the fearful fighting of last summer along the Chemin-Des-Dames, where for weeks the German Crown Prince hurled his men against the French position only to see them crushed and beaten. Last year seventy-five divisions were engaged in the German attacks along this line alone.

Line Straightening
The attack here is really in the nature of a line straightening operation. It is being launched from Laon as a center and is aimed at the elbow in the line formed during the fighting in Picardy in March and April. Here, however, the Germans must face permanent works which have been occupied by the French for long periods and which can be defended quite easily.

Allies Forewarned
Evidence that the Allied supreme command was forewarned of the new German attack may be found in the fact that British troops are fighting there. The German Crown Prince is in command in this sector and this may indicate serious effort to break the Allied line. Crown Prince Rupprecht, of Bavaria, is the nominal commander
