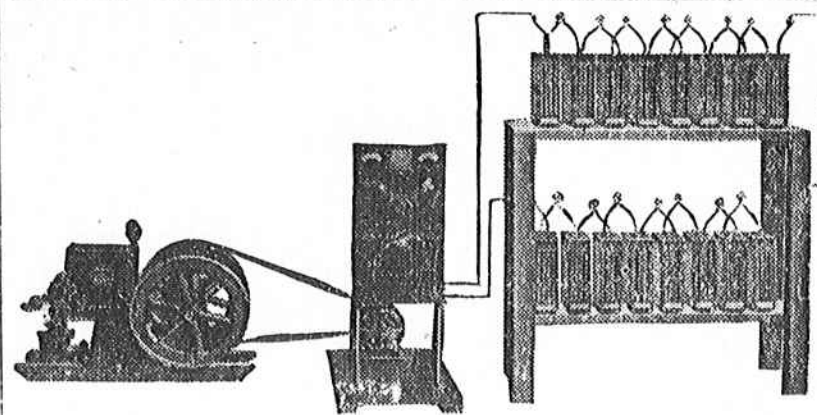

They shall then proceed publicly to count the votes. After tabulating the result, they shall certify the same and forward the ballot box, containing the ballots, poll lists and all other papers, except the original club book, to the County Chairman within thirty-six hours after the close of the ballots.

Before opening the polls the managers shall take and sign the oath provided for in Rule 31; before voting each voter shall take the oath provided for in Rule 32. Special attention of the managers is directed to Rules 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34 and 45.
