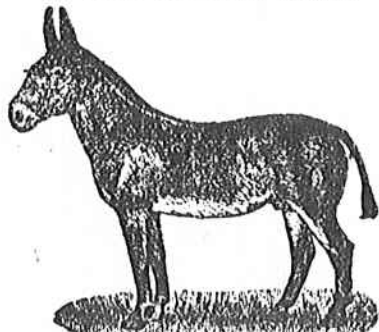

Bolsheviki Hedging

Archangel (via London) Aug. 25.—An official announcement issued here today denies the charge made by Lenin and Trotsky that the British, French, and American forces disembarked at Archangel are 'brigands calling upon the proletariat to fight the bolsheviks.'

'The allies, says the statement, were invited by the legitimate government of the northern region as represented by the constituent assembly, for the expulsion of the Germans and the invalidation of the Brest-Litovsk treaty, "traitorously signed by the bolsheviks."

The statement adds that the allies however, distinctly specified that they had no intention of mixing in the internal government affairs.

AMERICAN STEAMER DAMAGED IN STORM

Toulon, via Paris, Aug. 25.—The American steamer Chaster Sun, damaged in a storm, has been brought into this port by an American destroyer which hastened to her help in response to wireless calls.

Available shipping records do not contain the name of the vessel mentioned in the above dispatch.

SPAIN'S PROTEST REJECTED BY GERMANY

Basle, (via Paris), Aug. 25.—The crisis between Germany and Spain over the U-boat controversy has been further intensified by Germany's reported non-acceptance of Spain's protest against the continued German submarine offensive on Spanish shipping. In that protest Spain had threatened to confiscate an interned German vessel for every Spanish ship hereafter sunk by a U-boat. Germany, according to the official Nord Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung, has declined to accept the Spanish position.

In diplomatic circles it is reported that Berlin objects particularly to the threatening tone adopted by Spain. Germany fears a 'crawl' in response to the Spanish threat would greatly

BRITISH CAPTURE 17,000 PRISONERS

London, Aug. 25.—Seventeen thousand prisoners have been taken by the British Third and Fourth armies since August 21. Field Marshal Haig announced in his official day bulletin.

Along the whole front between Arras and the region east of Albert the British made important headway last night and today capturing a number of important places, particularly on both sides of Bapaume.

The text of the statement follows: 'Our attack north of the Somme is continuing.'

'Our troops hold the road from Albert to Bapaume as far as the outskirts of Lesars and have captured Contalmaison and Warlencourt and Eaucourt.'

'North of Bapaume we have taken Spignies and Behagnies.'

'The number of prisoners taken by the third and fourth armies on the battle front since the morning of the 21st of August and passed through collecting stations now exceeds 17,000.'

'A counter attack attempted by the enemy early last night against our positions recently gained north of Bailleul (Flanders) broke down under our fire.'

MORE BLODISH IN RUSSIAN REVOLTS

Amsterdam, Aug. 25.—Twenty persons, including three members of a foreign commission, have been killed in Petrograd in the course of counter-revolutionary riots, according to Moscow dispatches tonight.

Moscow papers state that a counter-revolutionary movement headed by General Alexieff and scheduled to break out on August 2, was suppressed by the arrest and execution of eight leaders of the movement. The purpose of the counter-revolt was to prevent the dispatch of troops to the Czecho-Slav front.

In the Volodga, Vladimir, Viathi and other districts, a revolutionary movement has been suppressed with great bloodshed, the dispatches state. Three hundred white guards are said to have been killed.

A revolt by the constantly-increasing white guards in Russia is imminent, according to the Moscow news-

impair her prestige, not alone with the neutrals, but with her allies with whom German dictatorial influence already has been gravely shaken by German defeats in the west. The consensus of political observers is that Germany is bluffing and will eventually back down.

Madrid advices to the German press state that the German ambassador to Spain has gone to Santander to see King Alfonso personally.

It is by no means certain, according to well-informed observers of the international situation, that Alfonso will see the German envoy.

The whole Spanish-German crisis is likened in some quarters to the situation between Germany and the United States just before America accepted the state of war created by Germany's sustained unrestricted U-boat warfare. It will be recalled that the German ambassador in Washington (Count von Bernstorff) was in those days bending night and main to make felt at the White House whatever personal influence he may have believed he could exert, and that he tried often and vainly to 'have a talk' with President Wilson, who, however, clearly realized that Berlin's acts were continually and diametrically in contradiction of its envoy's beseeching words.

All reports from Madrid agree that Spain, after four years of long suffering and patience involving hardships and humiliation, has finally made up her mind to adopt an unswerving attitude of defiance toward the German U-boat offensive, and that the Spanish government is at last fully resolved to take all consequences of such an attitude.

The next few days, therefore, are expected to bring either a German back-down, or sharpening of the crisis which may enlist Spain definitely in the ranks of the powers fighting Germany.

training at Plattsburg, and about 45 students with a month or more of training at this fine summer training camp. These will materially aid in the efficient training of the corps.

Ten hours per week will be devoted to the military, four in allied subjects, four in practical and two in theoretical military instruction. The members of the S. A. T. C. have the status of United States soldiers in the army, but are not to be called into active service except in cases of special military emergency. When they reach the draft age they register with their local boards and when it is stated that they are members of the S. A. T. C. they are placed in Class 5-D—those engaged in military or naval service.

If the new draft law lowers the age to 18 it is highly probable that all young men 18-21 who are prepared to enter college will be allowed to continue their course of study as long as military conditions continue normal. In any event, it is highly important in the present crisis for every young man to get as much education as possible.

As a college bred man he has a better chance to attend an officers' training camp and get a commission. Further, he is better equipped to serve his country, and if the war ends in a year or two his education will be uninterrupted.

AMERICANS CAPTURE GERMAN PATROL

With the Americans on the Aisne-Vesle Front, Aug. 25.—Although fires have been burning for three days between the Vesle and the Aisne, American patrols last night captured seven "contacted" German patrols, proving that the enemy has not withdrawn his line despite the menace to his Aisne-Vesle front from the north of Soissons and the American infiltration toward the Soissons-Rheims high road, which continues in spite of the many German machine gun nests.

The French Commission of the Red Cross has been requested by the Army authorities to assign two women for hut service for each aeroplane camp in France and in order to select the 80 women who will be needed for this service Miss Alice Hill Chittenden will visit a number of the Division Headquarters next month. It is not known exactly when Miss Chittenden will reach Atlanta, but the Southern Division Bureau of Personnel wishes to be able to put her in touch with suitable candidates as soon as she arrives. Therefore, women who are interested in this service and feel that they can qualify under its exacting requirements are requested to make application in the usual way for overseas service as promptly as possible.

The huts are in the nature of rest and recreation stations for flier whose work is especially nerve racking, as they frequently have much time on their hands they are in unusual need of a wholesome and homelike opportunity for relaxation. Women for this service must be between 20 and 40 years of age and the French Commissioner specifies that candidates should be "Fine, strong, good looking women, cheerful, refined and self-reliant."
