VELVET BEANS SOLVE
SOUTH'S FEED PROBLEM

The feed question is being solved in many parts of the South by abundant yields of velvet beans which were sown on a large acreage this year. Owing to the increased acreage in Georgia, that State alone could take care of 50,000 to 100,000 head of cat-tle from States where forage is the from States where forage is scarce, according to a report recently received by the Bureau of Crop Estimates. Large quantities of last year's velvet beans also remain on hand and are being used extensively in feeding dairy cattle. In tests conducted by the United States Department of Agriculture on the Congregate forms. Agriculture on the Government farms at Beltsville, Md., it was found that velvet beans compare favorably with cotton-seed meal, producing profitable gains when the beans are the sole concentrate of the ratio; that a combination of corn silage and velvet beans forms a satisfactory ration for fattening steers for market; that it is more profitable to feed soaked beans than it is to grind them; and that more beans will be eaten if soaked before they are fed than if they are fed dry.

In St. Louis County, Minn., where 85 to 90 per cent of the population are foreign born, or have foreign-born parents, the county home demonstra-tion agent of the United States De-partment of Agriculture and the State Agricultural College has helped the women attack some of their biggest problems. 
