PREPARED FOR THE COLD

American Soldiers at Archangel Have Extra Equipment.

Washington, Dec. 31.—The American troops operating in Archangel were fitted out in England with special clothing and other equipments to meet the rigors of the Russian winter. Secretary Baker said today in discussing statements made in the Senate yesterday that the troops were not adequately equipped.

"The troops in Archangel were fitted out with extreme care," Mr. Baker said. "While I was in London Gen. Biddle went over with me the details of their fitting out and assured me that, with the assistance of the British Government, they had had every attention paid to their equipment and that carefully selected medical personnel accompanied them."

Replying to a question as to reinforcements for the Archangel expedition, Mr. Baker indicated that this whole matter was still under consideration by the supreme war council at Versailles.

HIS FIRST PAYDAY ABROAD

President's Attorney Deposits Salary Check in Bank.

Washington, Dec. 31.—President Wilson today had his first pay day outside of the limits of the United States and the treasury warrant for \$6,250 drawn to his credit probably was the first presidential pay-check ever endorsed by any one other than the chief executive. When the President left the country he designated N. P. Webster, disbursing clerk at the White House, as his "attorney in fact," and Mr. Webster today received the warrant, endorsed it with Mr. Wilson's name, then signed his own as attorney and deposited the warrant in the bank to the President's credit.

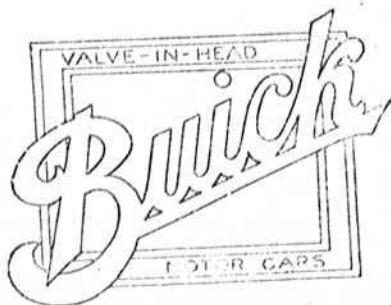
