To Honorable John S. Wilson, Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of the Third Judicial Circuit:  
The petition of M. W. Player would respectfully show:

I. That your petitioner is sixty-three (63) years of age and resides in said County and State.

II. That on the 14th day of November, 1918, Samuel D. Powell, late of said County and State, died intestate, leaving as his sole heirs and distributees at law his two children, Angnes Belle Powell, an infant nine (9) years of age and Charlie Kirk Powell, an infant seven (7) years of age, both of whom reside in said County and State.

III. That the wife of the said Samuel D. Powell, and the mother of the above named children, was the daughter of your petitioner, and she died in January, 1918.

IV. That your petitioner is informed and believes that the said Samuel D. Powell left a personal estate consisting of a Life Insurance Policy payable to said minors and also other personal property of the value of about Twenty-five Hundred (\$2500.00) Dollars; and also left an one-half (1/2) interest in ninety-five (95) acres of land and in addition another place of twenty-seven (27) acres, which last named tract of land was owned solely by the said Samuel D. Powell at the time of his death.

V. That the said minors have no general or testamentary guardian or guardians, and it is necessary that a guardian be appointed in order that their estates be fully protected.

VI. That your petitioner is the grandfather of said children and they necessarily are very dear to him, and being desirous of doing all in his power for their comfort and happiness, as well as to conserve whatever property they may be entitled to, he has been trying for several months to find a fit, competent and responsible person who is willing to assume the guardianship of the said minors, but that no fit, competent and responsible person can be found who is willing to assume said guardianship.

VII. That under these circum-

stances the Judge of Probate of said County and State should be required to act as the Guardian of the estates of the above named minors, and that upon the said Judge of Probate being so appointed that he and his sureties should be held responsible upon his official Bond for all of the estates of said minors received by him.
