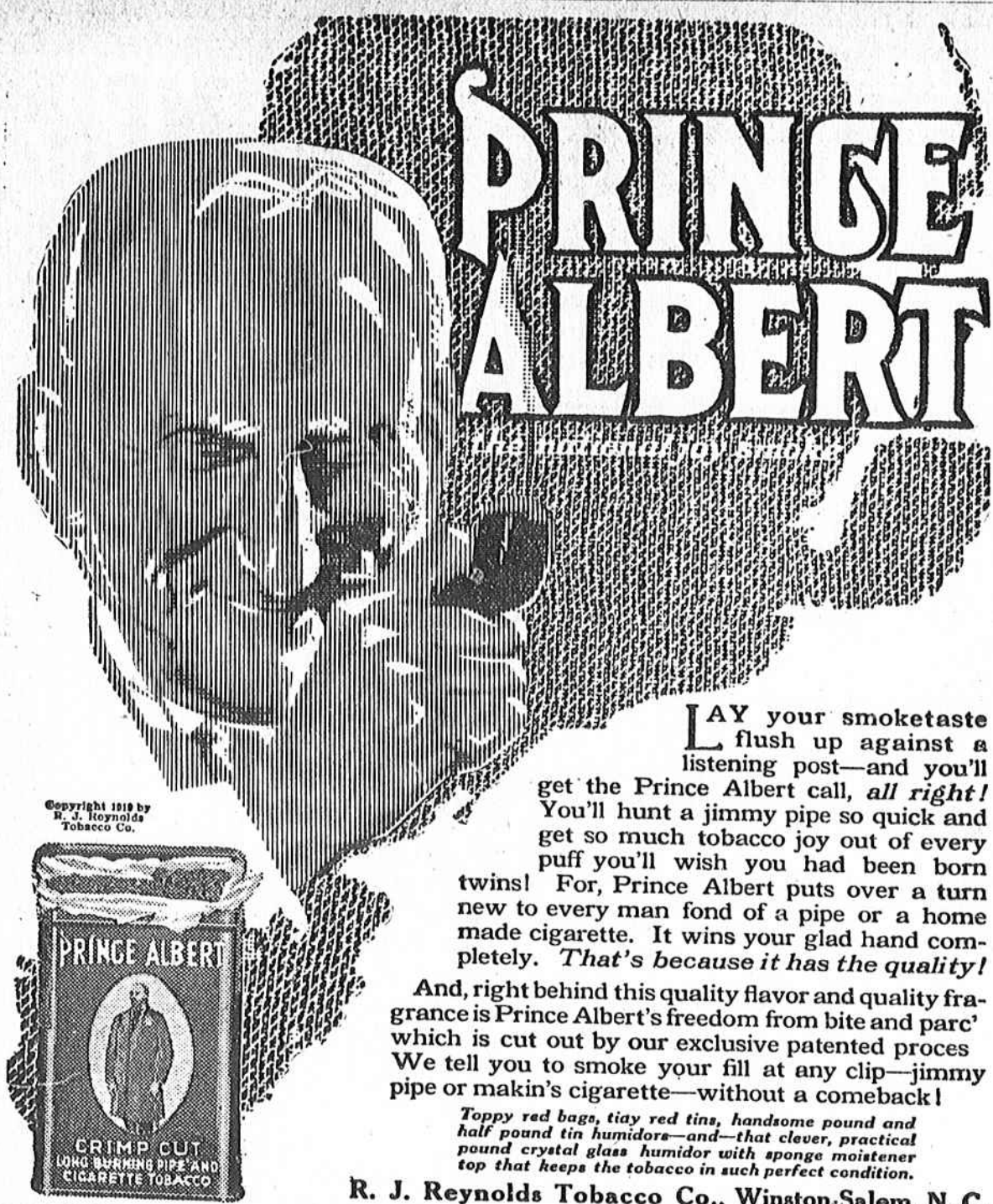

strengthened as a result of the speeches of Gustav Noske and Philip Scheidemann at the Weimar convention of the Majority Socialist party, according to the view of the non-socialist press and the opinion in various political circles in Berlin.

The proceedings of the convention thus far also appear to have demonstrated that the opposition to the members of their cabinets in their own party has been overcome, the lineup of the Majority Socialists seeming to reveal an unbroken front.

#### Attacks New Revolution

Zurich, June 13.—Speaking at the Majority Socialist convention at Weimar, Phillip Scheidemann, the German minister-president attacked the partisans of the "new revolution" whose object was to substitute soviets for the present government. He declared he would never make a compromise on a question like this, as it was a question of principle where all compromises were impossible.

Her Scheidemann remarked that while the political situation might be clearly defined, the economic situation of the country was very obscure.

#### For Kaiser's Protection

Berlin, June 11.—By the Associate Berlin, June 13.—Letters exchanged between officials of the League for Protection of William II, one of which refers to the remittance of 20,000 marks to Holland for the purposes of "cultivating" the Dutch press as printed by the Socialist paper at Vorwarts. The newspaper fears that the league must spend considerable more than this on its propaganda "in view of the determination of the entente to have the ex-emperor surrendered."

#### NO MORE CHEAP POTASH

Government Will Probably Put High Protective Tariff on Potash

Washington, June 10.—Protection of the potash industry in this country through establishment of a government controlled licensed system was urged before the house ways and means committee today by representatives of the industry, the bureau of mines and the geological survey. They declared that the fate of the industry depended upon the action by congress as it had not been developed sufficient to meet successfully the foreign competition.

"There is \$50,000,000 invested in this industry," declared Myron M. Parker, attorney for the United States Potash Producers Association. "And unless something is done immediately the entire industry will be dissolved and thousands of employees thrown out of work. Furthermore, the country will be dependent again upon foreign countries for the material, as it was before the war."

Mr. Parker said arrangements were made sometime ago for shipment of large quantities of potash from Germany in exchange for food, but that the plan was abandoned after producers here had shown this would ruin the industry. He added that the situation once more was critical, as contracts had been made for importing 20,000 tons from Alsace during the next three months.

A. G. White, of the bureau of mines told the committee one-half of the potash needed by this country was produced here at a cost of about 25 per cent higher than the foreign product. He added, however, that within five years potash could be produced in the United States as cheaply as in any other country, because there are great deposits in the Western States.

The need for restrictions on the importation of oxalic acid was urged by Lewis Emery, Bradford, Pa., of the American Alkali and Potash Company, who declared this industry was in the same stage of development as the potash industry.

#### TROOPS SENT TO EL PASO

24th Infantry Moves Under Orders of Gen. Cabell

Washington, June 13.—Orders sending the Twenty-fourth infantry to El Paso from Columbus, N. M., were issued by Major Gen. DeRosey C. Cabell, commanding the Southern Department. Gen. Cabell has wide latitude in arranging his forces to meet border emergencies, it was pointed out, and it requires no authority from the department for him to transfer regiments or other units to points of danger.

Memphis, Tenn., June 12.—Alonzo Young, a negro, who ran amuck here today and shot and killed John G. Brinkley, a police sergeant, and also wounded five other persons, was being rushed through the country in an automobile to Nashville tonight for safe keeping.

Fearing possible mob violence the negro was put on a train here late today for Nashville and at Jackson the chief of police, acting on a telephone message purporting to come from the chief of police here took the

negro off the train to put him in jail. It was discovered that this message was a hoax and fearing that it presaged mob violence it was decided to take the negro on by automobile.

### BERLIN PLANNING CITIZENS STRIKE

Secret Session of Citizens Council in Favor of It

WOULD LEAD TO CIVIL WAR

Another Berlin Dispatch Says Position of Present German Cabinet Has Been Strengthened

Berlin, Thursday, June 12.—A secret session of the citizens council of

Greater Berlin held on Wednesday, declared in favor of a citizen's strike according to the Independent Socialist newspaper Die Freiheit. The attendance included a number of leading manufacturers, merchants and professional men and Col. Rheinhardt, the Prussian minister of war.

The chairman of the meeting is quoted as declaring that a strike was necessary because the present government was incapable of redeeming Germany from the chaos.

It was planned, according to the newspaper, to have airplanes distrib-

ute leaflets announcing when the strike would begin. All the food industries, including the bakeries, would cease work, according to the plan, this leading to civil war, which it was held would help the bourgeoisie attain political power.

The citizens would be armed and Col. Rheinhardt is reported to have said the troops would be entirely on their side.
