As both the traffic and the revenues increase with the number of cars, there exists a possibility of so adjusting the registration rates as to keep pace with ever-growing maintenance charges.

Recently, however, a movement to capitalize the motor-vehicle revenues and devote these funds to road construction has been quite noticeable. This is especially true in those States which have a comparatively large number of cars and only a small

ACCUSED OF AIDING REVOLT

Minister Noske Arrests Socialists and Communists.

Berlin, June 27 .- (By the Associated Press.)-The Independent Socialist and Communist members of the execu tive council of the greater Berlin Soviet were arrested Thursday night by order of Minister of Defense Noske They are charged with having been in collusion with the leaders of the uprising in Hamburg.

The arrests followed the interception of a telephone message late Wednesday night between Hamburg and Berlin and which the insurrectionist at Hamburg informed the Berlin codi

cals that the time for another revolution was at hand and urged them to take active steps immediately. The local leaders are said to have advised the Hamburg leaders to arm their partisans for the purpose of opposing the government troops being mobilized against Hamburg.

The Independent Socialists and Com munists in the Soviet are facing charges based on treason. Among those said to be implicated are Richard Mueller, the chairman of the committee, and Herr Daumig, Muller is known by the sobriquet of "Over my dead body."
