Washington, July 21.—At midnight onight the known casualty list Washington's race war totaled ten, ncluding two deaths, and two men probably dying, while unconfirmed police reports placed the number at much greater figure. Of the dead, was a city detective, shot through ie breast by a negro women who was ir'ng indiscriminately from the upper

tory of her house. The negress, a girl about 17, as shot but not fatally. In another part of the city a negro firing from a garage door kept a provost guard of fors and marines at bay for several minutes but finally was

The probable death list in the nights fighting later was increased by the death of a sound city detective who succumbed to wounds received earlier in the evening in the fight which resulted in the instant death of his fellow detective.

Many clashes occurred between white men and negroes on street cars. One negro attacked on the back end the car and wounded four persons, but who was reported to have sent seven bullets into the negro's body. The White men were only slightly wound-

A crowd of more than 3,000 persons congregated at Peace Monument, at the foot of the capitol shortly after the house adjourned and members were leaving for their homes. A negro had started an argument with a white soldier and bystanders rushed to take a part. Street cars were halted and traffic was blocked for several hundred yards in each direction. Before anything serious developed, however, four automobiles filled with police reserves made through the crowd and halted the disturbance. Later in the evening Patrolman Bunn, crack shot of the department was struck by a bullet fired by a negro in the North west section of the city, the most exclusive residential district. The bullet struck the patrolman's arm and he was unable to return the fire. The negro escaped, outrunning a crowd of civilians.

Two negroes were seriously injured late in the afternoon near the house office building. One had been accused by several soldiers of having tried to of a car, fired into a crowd following steal a bicycle and when he attempted escape he was overtaken and beaten. finally was stopped by a city detective The other negro, believed to be a chauffeur for a representative, interveend and was beaten into unconsciousness.
