WILLIAM O. JENKINS HELD ON CHARGE OF PLANNING ABDUCTION

Mexico City, Mexico, Nov. 16 .-(By the Associated Press.)-William O. Jenkins, United States consular agent at Puebla, was placed under arrest Saturday under surveillance in his home charges by officials that Jenkins Puebla was not abducted by Federico Cordova, bandit leader, but was in connivance with him, according to information received here last night.

The arrest of Jenkins came after twelve peons had sworn to statements before a judge in Puebla, declaring that Jenkins had been seen in company with Cordova, who achis recent abduction omplished from Puebla, under no restraint and ip apparent understanding with his alleged captors.

Says Charges Absured.

Washington, Nov. 16 .- No word had reached the State Department through official sources concerning the reported arrest of Consular Agent Jenkins at Puebla, on charges of having convinced with the bandit who abducted him. Officials said a report probably will reach here early tomorrow.

DR. BURTS RESIGNS CHARGE

Columbia, Nov. 16.—The Rev. C. E. Burts, D. D., pastor of the First Baptist church of Columbia the last eight or ten years, tonight announced his resignation to become the head of the general Baptist board of South Carolina, created at the State convention here a few days ago. Dr. Burts will assume his new duties December 7, but will likely continue his pastoral duties until the end of the year. Dr. Purts is one of the most influential leaders of his denomination in the State and his church is reluctantly giving him up. The work of the new board provides a large and useful field, because of the enlarged scope of work made possible by the seventy ive million dollar campaign.
