Please give me space in your paper to express a few thoughts. I see in last week's Times that "Pinewood and Turbeville have the moving fever". What is the reason that these little towns want to leave Clarendon and go to Sumter county? Is it not because they have good reasons for wishing to leave us? Let us see.
Last year we had what we supposed was a law passed by our representatives from this county putting a license on all vehicles to create a tax for road building. There was considerable dissatisfaction, some claiming that it was unconstitutional and therefore not a law, but others that wanted to be on the safe side and do the right thing paid the tax, got the license tag from the collectors, and in most cases with the promise that if all parties were not made to pay that their money would be returned. Almost half of our people refused to buy the license and no steps were taken to have the offenders punished and some of our good citizens that paid went to the collectors to get the amount that they paid in returned, but were told that they could not return the money,

Now, I do think that such treatment from men that, we have to trust with our public officers is enough to satisfy any one.
Our officials had no right to do a thing like that. They should have known that the law was a law, and not to have collected any money on it until they were prepared to fulfill all their promises, and to protect the honest unsuspecting good citizens that trusted to their honor.
Now gentlemen we feel that we have been unfairly dealt with, but would be some what comforted if we could see any improvement in the roads, but the roads and bridges are as bad as ever, and we cannot see where the nice little sum we paid in has done us any good whatever. I do not suppose that any county can boast of worse roads than Clarendon and especially this section of the county. I hope that the roads in other sections are receiving better attention than the roads around here, if not I am very sorry for the other fellows also.
I see in the last issue that our Supervisor has been appointed to a much greater and more important position, namely that of road engineer carrying with it a salary of \$3,600. If he cannot take care of the roads and keep up the bridges as Supervisor,
