### AN OLD SOLDIER WANTS HIS PENSION

Hendersonville, N. C.  
July 21, 1920.  
The Board of Pensioners of Clarendon County, Manning, S. C.  
Gentlemen:—  
I am nearly eighty-three years old, and it has been nearly fifty-one years since I gave the State of South Carolina nearly four years of the best of my life and up to last year the State hadn't given me a penny. The Railroad has been more generous to me than

the State by reducing rates to the Reunions up to date I've never murmured, I put my name on the pension role from dire necessity from last Christmas two years and six months ago. I haven't been able to prepare my meals and now am not able to read what I am writing, and now at this stage of my life if the State is not able to give me but \$14.50, fourteen dollars and fifty cents, please take my name off the pension role. The little State of Florida is now giving her old soldiers from \$15.00 to \$20.00 per month. Archie Lowder, brought up near Oak Grove church, Clarendon County as a great many know is now in Florida and is now getting \$20.00 per month, and I must again say if the Board of Pensioners or the State is not able or willing to give me but \$14.50 for the entire year, take my name off the pensioners role. I do not wish to be disgraced I am now not able to earn a penny, while I was able to earn a living I asked for nothing nor do not think it very honorable to be on the pension list. I went to Florida for my health and improved except my eyes they are the same. I have a small farm in the fork of Black River which does not bring but little more than enough to keep the place in repair. I got my board in Miami, Fla., just as cheap as I can get it in Manning, S. C., or Sumter either and I am compelled to live from my pocket, only you do not pay according to what a man did in the war. I was promoted for meritorious service, I am much prouder of the honor than the office.

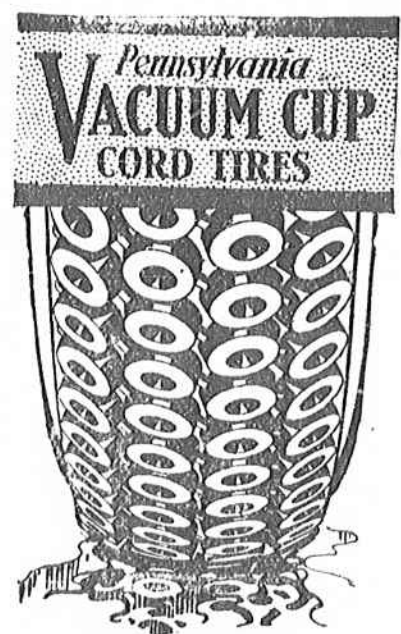
