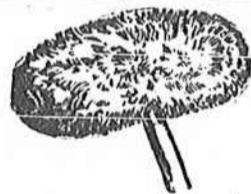

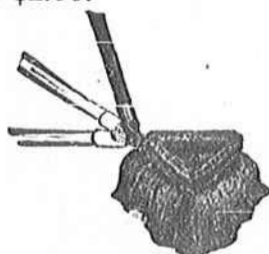

We deeply mourn her loss, but know it is her eternal gain.
