And Disbursements of Road Funds, in Sardinia District No. 28.

At the campaign meeting at New Zion, Mr. R. E. McFadden, a candidate for Supervisor, made the statement that the commissioners had used only a part of their road funds, and that there was a balance of over three hundred dollars that had been used by me.

I disputed the statement, and asked the Chairman to appoint three men to investigate and find out the facts; this not having been done, I think that the disposition of the funds should be known, which is as follows:

We gave Mr. McFadden a verbal order to get culverts, he has never reported how many he got, and has never offered to pay for them.

We put in the district 34,745 feet of lumber that cost \$1,590.50 and we paid for hauling, labor and nails, making a total of \$1,921.53 that was put in the district that they did not pay for.
