Republican National Committee supply information regarding Republican campaign funds was made tonight by Governor Cox, Democratic Presidential candidate, who came here today from Columbus. Governor Cox declared that Mr. Hays' statement yesterday regarding Republican funds was not a reply to the Governor's charges that Republicans were raising a fund, of \$15,000,000.

"I was very much gratified" said Governor Cox, that "Mr. Hays made his response but as I read his statement I find that it is no denial. He says the irregular preliminary estimate is \$3,000,000. That does not mean anything. I want Mr. Hays to tell us into how many subdivisions the country was divided by the Republican managers. I want him to tell us how many subdivisions there are and what territories each covers, and incidentally I want him to tell what the quote was that was imposed on each district." He has spoken publicly of about these quotas and the public is entitled to this information. The Senate investigating committee will insist on it and why not have it now.

In addition to his statement tonight, Governor Cox said that in his speeches late this week he would deal further with the question of Republican finances. He has promised evidence to support his charges that \$15,000,000 was the Republican "low mark with the sky apparently the limit."

Will Probe Says Reed.

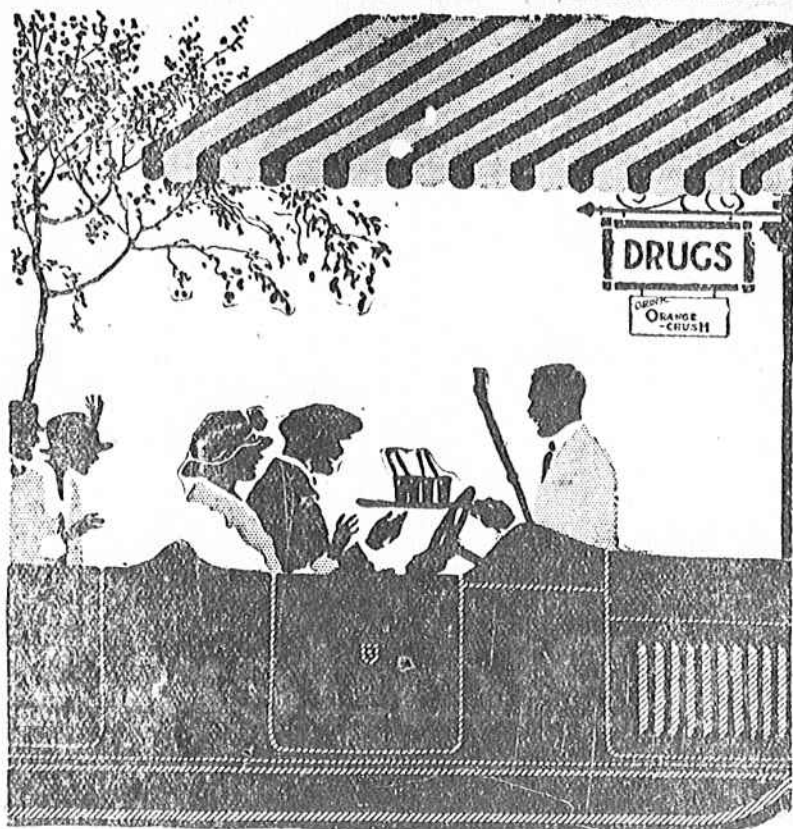

Governor Cox also made public tonight a telegram sent to W. P. G. Harding, Governor of the Federal Reserve Board at Washington requesting that steps be taken "on aid in moving the fall crops." My attention has been directed in several parts of the country," said the Governor's telegram, "to a condition which I think the Federal Reserve Board should and can correct." It is with reference to the movement of crops, farmers allege that grain elevators are unable to procure sufficient credit to take in the season's yield. The farmers are without sufficient grainary facilities to carry it over. In many instances this creates unnaturally fictitious prices. I am giving this information as a private citizen believing that the general welfare will be concerned thereby.

To Visit Many States.

Governor Cox came to Dayton from Columbus early today, following his return from his speaking engagement last Saturday at Canton, to clean up personal affairs preliminary to his speaking trip this week. He will leave here next Tuesday night to make addresses Wednesday at Princeton and Evansville, Ind., at Pittsburg on Thursday, New Haven, Conn., on Friday and in New York on Saturday.

A statement made tonight by the Governor, commenting on his reception last week said, "the most striking thing is the large representation of young men. I think they are an established element in the new generation. I think they are better and in government and especially in being in this war to an end. Their moral vision and character and their normal outlook elevated. Next to this is the new approach to the political power which this campaign is developing." The Governor's statement also said that he was not making a partisan issue of the league of nations. "We're making our fight," he said, "on what we believe to be a righteous movement,

world wide in its possibilities for good. I believe the rank and file of the Republicans are opposed to the Senate oligarchy." Governor Cox added he found "resentment" among Republicans because, he said, the popular primary candidate was not chosen at Chicago.

POLICE CHIEF IS KILLED

Winston Salem, N. C., Aug. 22.—Chief of Police Matthews of Walnut Cove, N. C., and Walter Martin of Madison, are dead and a negro whose name was unknown is seriously wounded as the result of a battle in the road one mile north of Walnut Cove between a sheriff's posse and three Madison, N. C., escaping prisoners late this afternoon. The shooting was the result of a row at a carroll dance hall when he negro insisted on dancing with white show girls. A disturbance was created and the Madison men, including Martin, Jack Hawkins and the negro were placed under arrest.

Enroute to the mayor's office they escaped and fled in a waiting automobile. Chief Matthews formed one of a posse summoned to pursue the fleeing prisoner and they were overtaken a mile north of Walnut Cove. A summons to surrender met with a fusillade and Matthews was shot through the stomach. Crumpled in his seat he shot and killed Walter Martin, while Jack Hawkins and the negro escaped. The negro was trailed a couple of miles by blood clots but was lost in a swamp and blood clots have been ordered by the posse. Hawkins later was captured and held in jail for safe-keeping.

A STATEMENT FROM

SENATOR E. D. SMITH

Giving the Facts on Roll Calls in Reply to a Circular issued by H. L. Scaife

There is being given circulation throughout the state by a pamphlet purporting to come from Hon. H. L. Scaife, of Washington, D. C., making an attack upon my record in the United States Senate. The basis of the publication is that I have neglected my duties as Senator by not attending to some of the roll-calls.

I have challenged publication of my record in this respect during the campaign and since the issuance of this circular with the average of those Senators who stand high in the Senate and in their respective parties. The challenge was not accepted and for the information of my friends throughout the State I wrote to the Hon. Charles M. Galloway, former Civil Service Commissioner and now practicing attorney in Washington, requesting that he compile from the Congressional Record the record in respect to roll-calls of the following Senators:

Senator Hitchcock, Democrat, Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee when the Democrats were in control of the Senate and Democratic leader in the Senate during the treaty fight.

Senator Owen, Democrat, Chairman of the Banking and

Currency Committee under Democratic control of the Senate and one of the leading authorities on banking and currency in the country, a candidate for President, endorsed by his state and voted for at 800,000,000 by his state delegation to the last Two years ago he was re-elected and re-elected by his state with a plurality of 30,000.

Senator Penrose, Republican, Chairman of the Committee on Finance and acknowledged leader of the Republican forces, both of the Senate and the country.

Senator Tillman, Democrat, Chairman of the Naval Affairs Committee under the Democrats, whose record in the Senate needs no comment as to his diligence and faithful attention to his duties as Senator, as well as to his statesmanship.

Senator John Sharpe Williams, Democrat, whose long services, both as Congressman and Senator, and whose usefulness to his party and nation is unquestioned and who is recognized as the finest scholar and most forceful debater in the House or Senate.
