During the last year a farmers' exchange in Beaufort county, N. C., saved its members and the farmers in community between \$75,000 and \$100.000, according to a report to the United States Department of Agriculture.

The organization, formed to aid po-tato growers, has shown high pro-ficiency in cooperation. Last season and the selling of potatoes. Thirty-five thousand barrel covers were bought at a saving of \$700, and 126 carload lots of potatoes were sold with a saving of \$50,000. A freat growth
