DR. WM. SIMONTON PACK

Greenville, Dec. 12.—Dr. William Simonton Pack, 60 years of age, practicing physician in Greenville for more than thirty years, died at his home here this afternoon after an illness extending over a year. Besides his widow he is survived by two sons, William Marion and Dr. Alva S. Pack, of Greenville, and three daughters, Mrs. H. Warren McCullum, of Sumter; Mrs. W. Lawrence Bentz and Miss Edna Pack, of Greenville, and also one brother, C. H. Pack, of Greenville. He graduated from the College of Charleston in 1889, and practiced medicine in Manning, for three years before coming to Greenville.

Prior to beginning his study of medicine, he was an extensive planter in Clarendon County. He was a member of the Greenville County Medical Society, State Medical Association and American Medical Association for over thirty years. In 1883 he married Miss Mary Louise Wilder, of Sumter.
