TO INVESTIGATE THE COTTON MARKET

New York, March 21.—Evidence in a recent "John Doe" investigation of the American Cotton Exchange, accused of operating a bucket shop will be presented to a grand jury tomorrow, District Attorney Barton announced today.

Assistant District Attorney Simmons who will present the case against the exchange, announced the hearing would require several days. It is understood that all witnesses who testified at the "John Doe" hearing or who may be called during the grand jury investigation, will receive immunity from prosecution. Several of these witnesses, by their own admissions, were involved in the alleged unlawful practices of the exchange. Involuntary petitions in bankruptcy were filed today against Randolph Rose, Sr., and Randolph Rose, Jr., who traded under the name of Rose & Son and against Rose & Company, a firm consisting, according to the petition, of Randolph Rose, Sr., and Celia Manasse. Rose & Son were among firms whose activities Chief City Magistrate McAduo said will be laid before the grand jury after they had been involved in testimony at the "John Doe" hearing.

The petition against Rose & Son estimate the firm's liabilities at \$150,000 and assets at \$125,000. That against Rose & Company estimated liabilities at \$107,000 with assets undetermined.

A. W. Graham, president of the American Cotton Exchange, declared the exchange was not affected in any way by the Rose failure.

Randolph Rose Jr., had previously resigned from the vice presidency and directorate of the exchange, he said.

The failure automatically suspends the firms, he added. Counsel for Rose issued a statement attributing the failures to pressure following the "John Doe" hearings. Rose and Son paid out more than \$100,000 in an effort to stem the bankruptcy menace he said.

SPECIAL MEETING OF SUMTER BAR ASSOCIATION

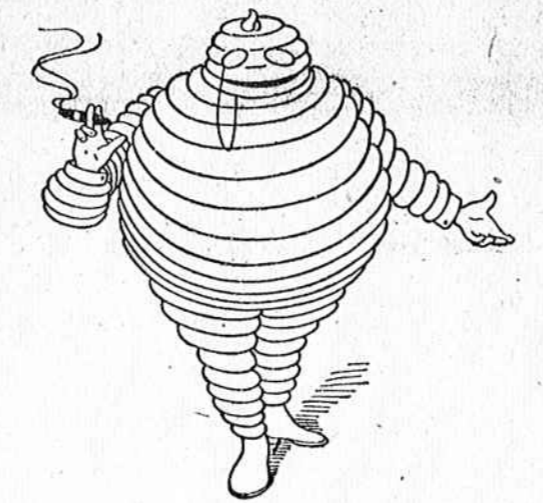
