HOME PRESERVATION OF EGGS. During the spring months of the

The method that Mas given probably the best results is the water glass method. The chemical name of water glass is sodium silicate. In any method of home preservation the object is to surroud the eggs with some material which will fill up the pores in the shell and keep the normal liquids within the shell from

> Method of Using Water Glass. In this method use the following materials: Stone or earthenware crocks, a supply of sodium silicate, or water glass, and strictly fresh eggs Each crock should have a cover.

In putting eggs down in water glass the following proceedure should be followed. The crock should be washed and sterilized with boiling hot water. Be sure that it is absolutely clean. May 15 .- Pine View Sewing club. The preserving solution should be made up by taking 19 parts of water which has been boiled and cooled and 1 part of sodium silicate. Mix and stir thoroughly. The eggs should be carefully placed in the crock, small end down, care being taken so as not to brea kor crack any of the shells. May 22.—Saxe-Gotha Cooking Fill the jar up to about 2" of the top with eggs and then pour in the water glass solution and fill the crock to May 24 .- Fair View Home Demon- the top. The eggs will then be covered with 2" of this water glass so-May 25 .- North Edisto Poultry lution. Place the cover tightly on the crock and set the contents in a dark cool place. By putting the cover on tightly evaporation will be lowered to a minimum. Put the preserved eggs in a basement or cellar on an elevated bench. Examine the crocks occasionally to see if more solution is needed to keep the eggs properly submerged.

DOUBLE DECK CARS WILL BE ALLOWED.

Washington, April 14th .- Effective May 1, shippers of hogs and calver from Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina and Virginia may be furnished double decked freight cars. nearly 50 per cent, as a double deck Only absolutely fresh eggs should car can accomodate as many as two

Instantly a loud complaint emanated from shippers, who, desperately because of the condition of the cotton market, had turned to the production and shipment of hogs.

According to a statement today furnished the Interstate Commerce Commission by F. D. Claggett, assistant freight traffic manager of the Southern Railway Company, the tariff was issued by Agent Cottrell through mistake. The case was pressed before the commission by Representative H. P. Fulmer of South Carolina who acted on request of shippers from Springfield and other sections of South Carolina. Regarding the admission of Claggett that the tariff which proved so costly to the shippers, had been issued through mistake, Mr. Fulmer said tonight:

"I am unable to see how this tariff was published through error, and I think it is offered as an excuse. But with such an admission by the railroad, it seems to me that shippers have a very clear claim against the Southern Railway for a return in the difference paid by them and the amount they would have paid had they obtained what they asked for. namely double decked cars."
