AUTO CRUSHED BY TRAIN.

There came near being a serious accident at the Buck Swamp crossing of the Atlantic Coast Line near Latta Tuesday afternoon when the southbound passenger train No. 89 crashed into Mr. N. A. Berry's Maxwell car.

Mr. Berry was returning from Marion via Latta and as he reached the crossing the car seemed to lose power going up the incline and as the machine reached the centre of the track it came to a standstill. At this moment a thin cloud of smoke was seen over the crown of the hill toward Dillon and after repeated efforts to move the car Mr. Berry ran up the track and attempted to flag the train but the engineer failed to slacken his speed and the train struck the car with full force. The force of the impact smashed the car into fragments and the front trucks of the engine were torn from their fastenings. In the car with Mr. Berry were Mrs. Berry and Mrs. L. A. Manning but the occupants escaped without injury.

The crossing at this point is very rough and when the car settled between the rails it could not be moved either way under its own power. It was not due to any defect of the car or to any carelessness on the part of Mr. Berry. The Buck Swamp crossing has been a source of annoyance to the traveling public for many years, and it is particularly hard for autos to cross it even when it is in excellent condition.

After a delay of several hours the damage to the engine was repaired and the train proceeded on to Florence.

A fine horse belonging to Mr.

E. A. Bethea and driven by Mr. Asa Bethea became frightened at the wrecked automobile and ran across the trestle badly skinning its legs and injuring Mr. Bethea.
