TAX RETURNS FOR 1920.

To Be Made by School Districts.

All persons owning personal prop-
erty or those acting as agents for oth-
ers are required by law to list the
same for taxation between January
1st and February 20th, 1920. The
auditor's office will be open during
this period for the purpose of accept-
ing returns.

All property must be listed in the
school district in which same is lo-
cated. Persons owning property in
more than one district must use a
separate blank for each district. It
is absolutely necessary that the audi-
tor have the name of the township
and the number of the school district
in which each taxpayer resides in or-
der that each school district may re-
ceive its proper portion of funds for
school and other purposes.

All males between the age of 21
and 60 years, except those exempt by
law, are liable to a poll tax of \$1.00.
All males between the age of 21 and
50 years are liable unless exempt by
law to a commutation road tax of
\$2.00. (Age for road duty and
amount of tax subject to change.)

Real estate will not have to be re-
turned this year unless you have
bought, sold or transferred some or
built new buildings since last return
was made. If any change has been
made in real estate since last return
it will be necessary to report same to
the auditor.

The law requires a 50 per cent
penalty be added to the taxes of all
persons not making their returns be-
fore February 20th. This law as well
as all others in regard to the conduct
of this office will be rigidly enforced.

Note (All parties owning automo-
biles will be required to give the

name of the car, the year manufac-
tured and whether it is a touring
roadster or sedan car.

TREASURER'S NOTICE.

The books for the collection of
county, state, poll and road tax will
be opened in my office, October 15
and will continue open until the last
day of December, 1919, without pen-
alty. After said date the following
penalties will be added:

One per cent January, 1 per cent
additional in February, 5 per cent
additional until the 15th day of
March when the books will close.

liable to a capitation road tax of \$3.00
unless exempted by law.

matter by dropping the Treasurer a
card asking for the amount of their
taxes, so as to avoid sending the
wrong amount, also stating the town-
ship or townships (if property is
owned in more than one) and if pos-
sible give school district where prop-
erty is located. After paying taxes
examine your receipts and see if all
your property is covered; if not, see
about it at once.

All persons writing for information
or asking for receipt to be sent to
enclose the return postage, as no
provision is made for this item of ex-
pense.

By following the above suggestions
complications and additional costs
may be avoided.

Any person wishing the amount
of their taxes will write me not later
than December 1st.
