The age-old custom of rushing cotton to the market in the fall only played into the hands of the buyers, who, having forced prices to the lowest point, stocked up hevaily, and then prices advanced, to their profit but to the loss of the growers.

Let the Bouth hold its cotton and market it slowly, during twelve months, instead of in four, and the producer will then soon hold the whip handle and no longer be driven by the lash of the buyers. At the same time the South should give its attention more largely to diversified agriculture, raising a full supply of foodstuffs, for its own use and to add to the nation's food store, making cotton a surplus crop. For a quarter of a century the Manufacturers' Record has sought to drive home the idea that every Southern farmer should raise his own foodstuffs and then plant in cotton his surplus land only. In that way lie prosperity and safety, and in that way only.
