

### Dan Moody Seen As Running Mate Governor Smith

**PRESIDENTIAL BOOM STARTED  
IN NEW YORK; CLEVELAND  
MAY GET CONVENTION**

New York, Mar. 8.—The campaign for nomination of Governor Alfred E. Smith as democratic presidential candidate already is under way, it was declared today following a conference of party leaders here.

John F. Carew, chairman of the New York State Democratic delegation in the House of Representatives, made the statement following a conference between the delegation and George W. Olvany, leader of Tammy Hall.

"We are already at work and propose to nominate him," said Representative Carew, "our assurances from virtually every state are that Al Smith is wanted by a majority of the democrats for president."

Mr. Olvany added that in his opinion, "the nationwide sentiment for nomination of Governor Smith is of such proportions that the governor should be asked to permit his friends to go to work for him."

The conferees were understood to have reached virtual agreement that it would be to Governor Smith's advantage to hold the national convention at Cleveland, rather than Denver.

States in which Smith boomers already are at work, Representative Carew said, included Maryland, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Minnesota, Wisconsin and North and South Carolina.

"And we will get some delegates from Texas," he asserted.

The conferees said they had received reports that Governor Dan Moody, of Texas, who has been mentioned as a possible running mate for Smith, soon would confer with the New York governor at Albany.

### DEATH OF MRS. J. C. PARKER

In the midst of the battle on February 28, 1927, in Baltimore, Md., the immortal spirit of Mrs. J. C. Parker left its earthly tabernacle and passed into the fathers home above.

Mrs. Parker, before her marriage, was Miss Sallie Stevens of Lorris, S. C. Born March 10th, 1880 and was in the forty-seventh year of her age. On July 13, 1915, she was married to Mr. J. C. Parker who was at that time in the Naval Store business in Lorris.

She is survived by her husband, four brothers, and one sister: Messrs. M. D. and W. H. Stevens of Lorris, S. C., R. B. Stevens of Raleigh, N. C., and P. P. Stevens of St. Paul, N. C., and Mrs. Mary Harrelson of Lorris, S. C.

Mrs. Parker became a Christian in early childhood. She was a woman in whom the loveliest traits of Christian character grew and flourished. She was a devoted wife and a real help-mate to her husband and a loving sister and daughter, a friend to all.

She was honored and loved by all who knew her. But above all that can be said of her is her remarkable zeal, love and service for her Master and His Kingdom.

At the time of her death she and her husband were zealous missionaries in the church of "The Pillar of Fire" in Baltimore, Md.

It may be truly said of her she lived for Him and with Him. Like Enoch, she walked with God. Most fitting in her case are the Master's words: "Well done good and faithful servant, thou hast been faithful in a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things. Enter thou into the joy of thy Lord."

#### Winthrop Bill

Columbia, March 10. A last desperate assault against the senate bill adding the name of Johnson to Winthrop College failed in the senate last night and the bill was passed on third reading to the house of representatives.

In the course of the fight, the senate voted down a motion by Senator Williams of Aiken to continue the bill by a 19 to 17 vote. After a motion by Senator Moore of Abbeville to postpone debate until the third Wednesday in January, 1928, was defeated 24 to 18.

"While I have noticed that when one dealing with a question of sentiment, argument is light" the Aiken senator said. "This is a very serious question, I mean no disrespect to the great educator when I say that it is impossible to judge a man's reputation until the book of his life is closed.

"During the war I fought on this floor a proposal to build a monument to the eternal friendship of the allied nations. The bill was interrupted. Within a few months, Russia laid down on the job. Had the monument been built, we would have had to chisel the name of Red Russia from the face.

"If we must hurry to perpetuate a man's name before he dies—lest it be forgotten, his name does not deserve perpetuation."

After the motion to continue the bill had been defeated, Mr. Williams warned the senate that "From now on you must be prepared to go on down the line when asked—add Coward to the name of Citadel and Douglas to the University Treat all requests impartially.

Replying to the Aiken member, Senator McCall said, "Why should we even entertain the fear that after such long service to the state, the object of this honor would do anything to detract from our esteem of him. After having gone this far can we turn back now and repudiate his work, let it be known that the senate does not appreciate him?"
