

Minimum Scale Is Much Lower

Half To Third Lower Since Action of FERA On Oct. 30. Local Scale Followed.

Columbia, Dec. 1.—With the dropping of the 30 cents an hour minimum scale by the FERA the wage scales over most of South Carolina have been fixed at one-half to one-third of the former minimum.

Reports of the action taken by county wage scale committees indicated that the majority found 10 to 15 cents an hour more in keeping with the local scale for common labor in private enterprises.

The new wage scales, graduated upward on this basis, have been prepared and submitted to state relief headquarters with proportionate allowances for semi-skilled and skilled workers.
