Columbia, Jan. 20.—(Special to The Chronicle).—Eight Laurens county motorists had their driving privileges withdrawn during the month of December, according to a report this week from H. E. Quarles, Jr., director of the motor vehicle division of the state highway department. Throughout the state, a total of 479 driving licenses were withdrawn by the department during the month.

The offense of each Laurens county violator was driving while under the influence of intoxicants, and in each case the driving license was suspended. The age groups of the offenders, one of whom was a woman, were as follows: 17 to 29 years of age, four persons; between the ages of 30 and 39, one person; and three violators were 40 years of age or above.


