given when introduced.

The speakers explained what AA
is, who its members are, why anony-
mous, why it has no paid members
for any service rendered, and how
alcoholics all over the country have
been saved from the drink curse and
are now living lives of sobriety and
usefulness. All of the speakers said
they were members of the organiza-
tion and related personal experi-
ences and told of the great joy and
satisfaction that had come to their
homes since they expressed an hon-
est desire to "clean up" and live up
with the organization. "We band our-
selves together to help each other
day by day," they said. An invitation
was extended to all men and women
in the county with alcoholic problems
to join the organization whose mem-
bership is confidential.

It was the first open meeting of
the recently organized unit of Alco-
holics Anonymous in this county.
The large audience was impressed
with the earnest, heart-to-heart talks
of the speakers and gained valuable
insight into the work and purpose of
the organization which now has a
membership of more than 60,000 men
and women in a number of states.
