

COUNTY SUPPLY BILL

The county attorney receives \$250 in the 1948-49 bill, as he did in the 1947-48 bill; but the new supply bill contains a new provision of \$200 for an assistant county attorney, to be elected annually by the vote of the senator and a majority of the delegation, as the attorney is elected.

Other appropriations in the bill which remain unchanged from the 1947-48 supply bill are: Laurens county library, \$7,500; ladies rest-room, \$900; county health depart-

ment, \$4,340; expense in spraying DDT, \$200; six deputies at the mills, \$720; head mill deputy at Goldville as expenses for transporting prisoners and witnesses, \$300; board of assessors and equalization, \$1,000; insurance for court house, jail, county home, agricultural and chaingang camp buildings, \$625; vital statistics, \$310; printing, postage, and stationery, \$4,000; court house, \$4,000; beautifying court house lawn, \$100; county home, \$4,500; salary of superintendent, \$1,300; salary for Mrs.

Stribling, \$300; additional help to care for inmates, \$1,200; agricultural building, \$700; stenographer and materials for home demonstration agent, \$330; assistant county agent, \$660; public welfare, \$2,100; miscellaneous contingent, \$6,000; county board of education, \$850; for cleaning court house grounds, \$100; forest fire control, \$600; county national guard units, \$750.

Also unchanged are appropriations for magistrates, which are as follows: city of Laurens, \$1,200; clerk for stenographic help in holding inquests, etc., \$1,680; Clinton, \$1,000; office rent for magistrate at Clinton, \$120; constables at Clinton, \$900; Cross Hill, \$200; Waterloo, \$200; Gray Court, \$200; Youngs, \$200; Sullivans, \$200; Scuffletown, \$150; Jacks, \$150; for payment of jurors in criminal cases in magistrate's court, \$300.

Other changes in the 1948-49 bill from the 1947-48 supply bill are as follows: heating and janitor service for health center raised from \$1,000 in 1947-48 to \$1,600 in 1948-49; medical supplies decreased from \$310 to \$300; reindexing and improving indexing system in the office of the clerk of court decreased from \$750 to \$500; county jail, raised from \$6,000 to \$7,500; court expenses, raised from \$8,300 to \$10,000; boys 4-H club work, raised from \$50 to \$75; girls 4-H club work, raised from \$50 to \$75; Future Farmers of America, raised from \$50 to \$75; Future Home Makers, raised from \$50 to \$75; emergency relief, raised from \$600 to \$1,200; auditing county books, decreased from \$2,500 to \$1,500. New appropriations contained in the 1948-49 supply bill are \$600 for rent for A. C. building, and \$7,750 for purchasing of terracing equipment for the soil conservation department. Appropriations in the 1947-48 bill which were not carried over into the new bill were \$750 for painting public buildings and \$5,000 for permanent improvements at the county home.
