A forty-hour training course will be offered for Negro high school teachers at State Agricultural and Mechanical college, at Orangeburg, opening May 10, and continuing through Friday of that week.

The next institute in driver education will be presented for white high school teachers at Winthrop college on June 21, to continue through the 25th, and is scheduled as a part of the Winthrop college summer school.
