

## **Boll Weevil Control** Urged By Clemson

Clemson, May 8 .--- Boll weevill control, certification of planting seed, and getting gins ready for the fall season are stressed in the semimonthly Cotton letter issued this week by the Clemson Extension Serrice. Three extension specialists, L. M. Sparks, Jr., cotton insect and disease specialist; H. G. Boylston, cotton improvement specialist, and S. A. Williams, cotton ginning specalist, have timely statements in the etter on the above problems. In regard to boll weevil control,

Ir. Sparks says: "Despite the cold, wet winter we

still have plenty of live boll weevils. with us-2710 weevils per acre compared with 2904 in 1947. Let's kill them and other cotton insects this year with poisons. Buy your poisons and dusters now.

A small farmer with 5 to 10 acres of cotton can use a rotary hand duster. Twenty to 30-acre cotton farmers need a two-row mule-drawn duster or two-row- tractor-drawn duster. Larger acreages call for tractor dusters or airplane dusting. If you plan to use the 3-5-40 (BHC-DDT-Sulfur) dust do not forget to buy either chlorinated camphene or Chlordane (which is to be used at the farmer's own risk) to be used during migration time. BHC does not give lasting protection against weevils at this time."
