Deaths In County For the Past Year Given As 332

Columbia, June 1.—(Special to The Chronicle).—The total number of deaths occurring in South Carolina during 1947 numbered 17,153, according to a compilation completed this week by the bureau of vital statistics of the South Carolina Board of Health. The number of deaths among men in the state was higher than that of women for both races, with 5,114 white male deaths and 4,373 Negro male deaths reported, as compared with 3,718 white female and 3,947 Negro female deaths.

The same ratio applied to deaths in Laurens county, where 332 persons died during 1947. Of the deaths in the county, 99 were white male, 6 were white female, 89 were Negro male, and 58 Negro female. The diseases causing the largest number of deaths in South Carolina last year were heart diseases, from which 4,231 persons died. The next largest number of deaths to be caused by any one disease were the 1,518 deaths caused by kidney diseases, while cancer was the third most fatal disease, causing 1,373 deaths. Other diseases which were principal causes of deaths in the state last year were pneumonia, from which 862 persons died; tuberculosis, of which 544 died; and diseases of the digestive system, which caused the death of 547 persons.

MEN WHO DARED TO STAND FOR GOD

Lesson for June 6: Daniel 3:4-7, 13-18; 6:10.

Memory Selection: Daniel 3:16. Because of Daniel's interpretation of Nebuchadnezzar's dream, he had been raised to high place. At his request, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were set over the affairs of the province of Babylon.

When Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego refused to bow down to the image the king had raised, they were cast into a fiery furnace. But the king's "rage and fury" soon cooled when he gazed in astonishment upon four persons walking in the furnace. The fourth was recognized as a divine being. The three men were called forth and found to be unharmed. Then Nebuchadnezzar decreed that none should speak against the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, and the three men were promoted to great honor.

Daniel was not tried in the furnace. Later, when Darius had taken Babylon and set Daniel in chief place, his enemies plotted his destruction. When the king realized how he had been tricked, he labored to save Daniel, but was reminded that the laws of the Medes and Persians altered not. The king's sleepless night and his hastening early to the den of lions showed his terrible anxiety and a measure of faith in Daniel's God. Daniel came forth from the den unharmed. Then the king issued a remarkable decree concerning the God of Daniel.

We can but realize the moral majesty of Daniel and his friends. Men are now tempted to compromise to get on in the world. Dare to stand for God. The essential thing is to do right, whether you suffer or not.

Marion R. Wilkes At Port-au-Prince

Says The Laurens Advertiser: The family of Marion R. Wilkes of Washington, have learned from him that he is now in Port au Prince, Haiti, in the West Indies, conducting an examination of the National Bank of Haiti. Mr. Wilkes and his staff of examiners were loaned by the Federal Reserve Board to the Republic of Haiti for this purpose. The National Bank acts as fiscal agent for the government in handling the government debt, issues the paper money whose units are called "gourdes," and conducts a commercial banking business. Mr. Wilkes expects to be in Haiti for about six weeks.

Mr. Wilkes is a brother of E. Harry Wilkes of this city.
